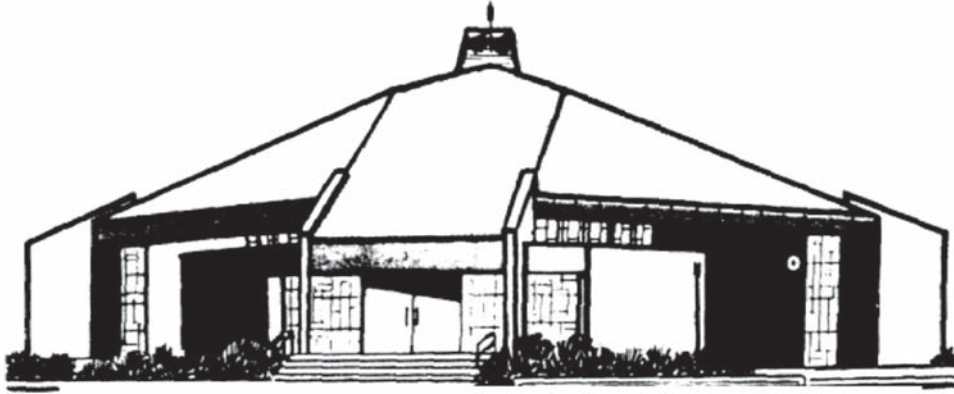

### BAPTISMS:

1st and 3rd Sunday at 1:00 PM. Baptism preparation classes are held on the 2nd Monday of Jan., March, May, July, Sept., and Nov. at 7:00 PM in Seton Hall. The parents are required to attend class so they will be familiar with the Baptism ceremony and the purpose of the sacrament. Please call the Rectory to make arrangements for the Baptism. After attendance at class, when all paperwork is completed (including obtaining and presenting godparents letters of eligibility), a Baptismal date will be scheduled.

### MARRIAGES:

Couples contemplating marriage should make an appointment with the Pastor at least six months before the date of the wedding. During this time the engaged couples complete their mandatory attendance at Marriage Preparation Programs and their individual sessions with the priest, including testimony, documents, etc. that are necessary to obtain & complete prior to the marriage.

### ANOINTING OF THE SICK:

This Sacrament is administered to the shut-ins and anyone who is sick. Emergency calls will receive prompt attention any hour of the day or night. If someone has already been admitted to a hospital, the local Chaplain should be called by the nurse. If any of our parishioners are hospitalized for an extended time, please inform the Rectory with the name of the person and the hospital.

**CONFESSIONS:** Saturday 4 to 4:45 PM & by appointment.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION RCIA** Program helps those who wish to become members of the Catholic Church or to complete the Sacraments of Initiation. Call the Rectory for information.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES** for students in Public School. Classes are held Sunday mornings and begin with the 9:30 AM Mass and end at 11:30 AM. Children's Liturgy of the Word is at every 9:30 Mass throughout the year.

**LITTLE CHURCH SCHOOL** is for 3 & 4 year olds during the 9:30 Mass.

**MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA DEVOTIONS** in honor of Our Blessed Mother are offered every Saturday following the 8:30 AM Mass.

**ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT** one hour before Morning Mass Monday to Saturday.

**ROSARY:** 20 Minutes before daily Mass

**PARISH REGISTRATION:** We invite all Catholics living within parish boundaries to become registered members as soon as possible. If you have recently changed your status, married, moved out of your parent's home or graduated from college, you need to register. If you move, we would also appreciate a phone call to the Rectory so that our records will be in order.

## **PASTOR'S CORNER 3/14/10**

There comes a time in all young people's lives when they leave home. Superficially, this seems to be the case in today's Gospel story of the prodigal son. The young man wanted to see the world. His loving father let him go. But to the Jewish audience of Jesus' day, the young son's additional request that he be given his inheritance is outrageous. An inheritance is only given when one's parents die. The younger son was in effect saying to his father, that as far as he was concerned, you are dead, I want nothing more to do with you. Broken hearted the father gave him his inheritance and the selfish younger son left.

Despite this, there is something that attracts us to the younger son. Perhaps we have felt a spirit of adventure stir within us. But I don't think anyone, who hears this parable, fantasizes about being like the elder son.

The younger son is fired up with energy and inquisitiveness. Initially his desires blind him to everything. But he grows. He learns by his mistakes. His virtue is not that he had the courage to run off and be sinful. Rather, his virtue is that he learned from his mistakes. The older son never learned this lesson. He never ventured. He always played it safe. For him, life was not about joy, discovery, and growth. Rather life was about safety, sameness and stagnation.

The thrust of the parable is the celebration of forgiveness and love of the Father. As we grow and seek to embrace life and enter into its joy, we will make mistakes. God will always forgive our mistakes if we simply return to him with as the younger son did.

## **SUMMARY OF THE CATHOLIC FAITH #27**

Last week we completed the various topics under the Teachings of the Church. With today's column we start a new topic: "Life in Christ: Grace and Commandments." Over the next several weeks we will be highlighting how we live our faith beginning with grace - God's help.

Sanctifying grace is a free gift of God which allows us to become children of God, to share in the divine nature and to inherit eternal life. It is the very life of God given to us through Christ in the sacraments. Just as with human life, there are certain powers or capabilities that come with sanctifying grace. These powers are called virtues.

Sanctifying grace gives us the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity. These virtues in turn give us the grace to have a supernatural relationship with the Holy Trinity. The virtue of Faith enables us to believe in God and believe all that he has said or revealed to us, including all that the church teaches. The virtue of Hope enables us to desire eternal happiness and to trust in Christ and his promises to obtain it. The virtue of Charity enables us to love God above all things for his own sake and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God.

Sanctifying grace also strengthens and helps us to further develop the human virtues, a.k.a. moral virtues. There moral virtues are grouped around four key virtues; namely, prudence, justice, fortitude and temperance. They are called Cardinal Virtues. Prudence enables us to know our true good and choose the right means of achieving it. It perfects the intellect. Justice enables us to give what we owe to God and others. It perfects the Will. Fortitude enables us to resist temptations and overcome obstacles. It helps to moderate fear. Temperance enables us to moderate our desire for pleasurable goods. It helps us to control our enjoyment of sensual pleasures.

## MEMORANDUM

**To:** Priests of the Archdiocese  
**From:** Cardinal Justin Riigali  
**Date:** March 1, 2010  
**Subject:** Termination of Flu Season Directives for the Celebration of the Sacred Liturgy.

The flu season directives which have been in force since October 18, 2009 provided a necessary pastoral response to the health risks associated with the H 1N1 Flu. The current information available from the Center for Disease Control confirms that the 2009 H1N1 Flu has significantly dissipated throughout the country and especially in our region. Individuals must still be encouraged to use good sense if they are ill and have flu-like symptoms when they are in group settings.

Therefore, with the notable change in the circumstances that prompted the flu season directives, it seems timely to terminate them. In the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, in all parishes and institutions, as of Sunday, March 14, 2010 the exchange of the sign of peace and the distribution of the Precious Blood for the faithful may be reintroduced in the manner indicated by the liturgical norms.

I am deeply grateful to you for your collaboration during this most recent flu season to assure the faithful of our concern for their good health during the celebration of the Sacred Liturgy. This information will be published on the Archdiocesan website as well as in the Catholic Standard and Times. Please communicate this same information in whatever way is most appropriate for your parish.

**PASTOR'S NOTE:** We have been extending a gesture of peace for several months now. We will continue are present practice. Our Eucharistic Ministers will also continue to use the sanitizing solution before distributing communion.

You can also use the message that is already there or you can modify it. One click and it is off to your Congressman, Patrick Murphy. Remind Congressman Murphy that his vote against the Senate Version will show his conviction for the right to life of the unborn.

Your action is needed now! The Speaker of the House is presently in the process of rounding up the undecided votes so as to pass it in the House. Your action may very well keep her from getting the needed undecided votes.

This is one of the most talked about and reflected upon gospel messages. It's known as the story of the Prodigal Son, but many of us prefer to call it the story of the Forgiving Father. Have you ever had the experience of being forgiven or "taken back" into your family or group of friends? Have you ever forgiven someone who really hurt you? Many times we hold onto grudges that just keep hurting us, but when we forgive, we feel so much better! During this Lenten season, let's ask Jesus not only to forgive us, but to help us forgive others.

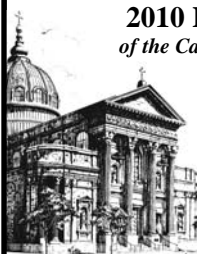
