Baptisms: Arrangements for Baptism can be made at the Parish Office prior to or after the baby's birth. A Pre-Jordan session is required of new parents. REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF FR. GREGORY J. HICKEY

New classes will start in the Fall

Are you interested in learning more about the Catholic Church? Are you unbaptized but recognize a need for spirituality in your life? Are you baptized Catholic or baptized into another Christian denomination but never received any formal religious instruction? Are you married to a Catholic and attend Mass but just don't know what the next step is to become one of the Catholic faithful? Are you yearning for something more in your life? Maybe you have been looking for enrichment in your life in all the wrong places.

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is the place for you. Every year adults are welcomed into the Catholic Christian Community through RCIA. It is a learning and loving process in which conversion of the heart brings you to Jesus Christ who is Our Lord and Savior. "Come to me, all you who are weary and find life burdensome, and I will refresh you. Take my yoke upon your shoulders and learn from me. For I am gentle and humble of heart. Your souls will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden light." (Matthew 11:28-30). Please feel free to contact Fr. Hickey or Mrs. Maria Boyer, who is the Director of Religious Education (DRE), for more information about the process.

Each parish is responsible for the formation of prospective members. This formation is guided by the needs of those who seek membership, the resources of the local community, and the norms of the Catholic Church. All parishes of a diocese are united through the ministry of the bishop who, as chief Pastor, is responsible for the initiation of new Catholic Christians. The bishop's role is clearly seen when he meets the catechumens for the Rite of Election at the beginning of Lent. The liturgy, celebrated at the Cathedral Basilica of SS. Peter and Paul, beautifully demonstrates the diversity and unity of the Church into which new members are initiated. This and other liturgies lead to the goal of Christian initiation.

The Order of Christian Initiation:

Period of Inquiry: This is a time of introduction to the Gospel of Jesus Christ and a reflection on one's own life. It is an unstructured time for questions and discernment.

Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens: This is the beginning of the journey of faith. They accept the way of Jesus, receive the Sign of the Cross, and join in the Liturgy of the Word of God.

Period of the Catechumenate: This is the time to discover the love and power of God in their lives and in the Church. Along with their sponsors, catechumens celebrate the Liturgy of the Word each Sunday, receive anointings, participate in prayers of faith, and take part in the mission of the Church of the world.

Election or Enrollment of Names: This usually takes place on the First Sunday of Lent at the Cathedral when Archbishop Chaput formally acknowledges the readiness of the Catechumens and calls them to the Sacrament of Initiation. Catechumens - the elect - respond by expressing their desire for these sacraments.

Period of Purification and Enlightenment: During the Season of Lent and before the Easter Vigil is a time of intense immediate preparation. Through prayer, study, and the Scrutinies, the elect experience the death and resurrection of Jesus in their own lives.

Sacraments of Initiation: This takes place at the Easter Vigil. The elect celebrate initiation in the threefold sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. They are anointed with Sacred Chrism and sealed with the Holy Spirit, are welcomed to the Eucharistic Table, and are incorporated into full membership in the Church.

Period of Mystagogy: This is the 50 day Eastertime following the celebration of Christian Initiation. The newly baptized now participate fully in the life of the Church. This is also a period of a more in-depth sacramental catechesis and reminds everyone that growth in faith is ongoing and lifelong.

Some terms that you may hear in Church:

Apostolic Witness: How we live out what we believe

Candidate: A person who is baptized into another faith tradition who is seeking membership in the Church. Candidates are different than catechumens who are not baptized. Candidates are brought into full Communion in the church with a Profession of Faith, Confirmation, and Holy Communion.

Catechumen: An unbaptized person who seeks entrance into the Church

Catechumenate: The process of formation leading to entrance into the Catholic Church

Time limit: Depends on the person but is anywhere from one to two years

Doctrine: What Catholics believe

Liturgy: How the community worships

Prayer: How we communicate with our God

Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist

The entire church of Saint Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother would like to welcome you to our faith community. All you have to do to begin the process is to contact Fr Hickey or Mrs. Maria Boyer, DRE. Have a good week and I hope you are taking some time this summer with family and friends to renew your spirit. Everyone is welcome to be in RCIA who wants to deepen their faith experience.
