The 2017 Christmas Collection amounted to \$21,328, which was slightly less than the \$21,464 from the previous year. Thank you so much for your support of the parish.

The “Cold and Flu” season is upon us. We can do two things to help minimize the potential spread of the virus causing sickness. For the exchange of the Sign of Peace, you can give a simple nod of the head to the people around you. Also, it is strongly suggested that those not feeling well to please refrain from receiving the Precious Blood.

Many people celebrate Valentine’s Day, February 14, by sharing a special meal at home or elsewhere. If you are making plans to do this, please know that February 14, 2018 is also Ash Wednesday, a day of Fast and Abstinence for Catholics. Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are seriously bound to restrict themselves to eat one full meal and two lesser meals on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Catholics over the age of 14 are seriously bound to refrain from eating any meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Please keep the Church’s laws on Fast and Abstinence in mind if you choose to celebrate Valentine’s Day on February 14.

### **Do you suffer from Celiac Disease?**

Our parish offers a special **low-gluten** host for those who join us for Mass, either during the week or for Sunday Mass. The low-gluten hosts we offer contain **.01% gluten**. According to the magazine, *Gluten-Free Living*, experts from the Center for Celiac Research at the University of Maryland call the host, “*Perfectly safe*”, stating, “*you would have to eat 270 wafers everyday to reach the danger point.*” (However, it is recommended that any Celiac suffers who wish to receive these hosts consult with their physician before usage.) Anyone who may be interested in receiving Holy Communion with a low-gluten host is asked to see Leo Brady or Father Nasta before Mass.

## *Faith Formation*

This is the second of a two part summary of Pope St. John XXIII's July 1, 1962 encyclical, *Paenitentiam agere* (*Doing Penance*), which was written to prepare the Church for the Second Vatican Council. What Pope St. John wrote over fifty-five years ago applies to us today.

He tells of two forms of penance that are to be undertaken. Internal penance entails a hatred of sin and a firm resolution to make reparation. This is manifested by those who go to Confession, attend Mass and receive Holy Communion. External penance keeps one's body under the control of reason and faith and, at the same time, makes amends for one's own sins and those of others. It includes accepting from God the hardships, inconveniences and annoyances we face as part of living life each day. No one can escape from this penance, which helps to bring about God's mercy and forgiveness for our sins and special grace for the work of the Council. It also makes us look forward to the heavenly realm of eternal peace and joy.

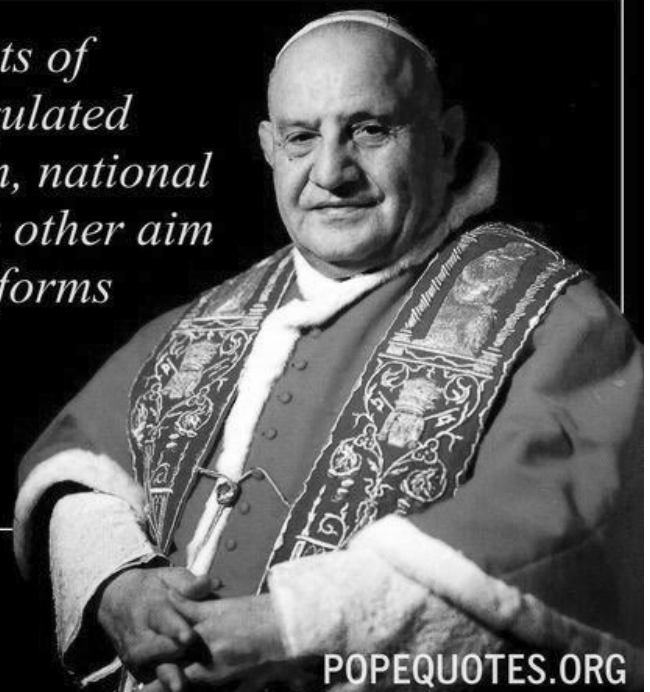
John also encourages the faithful to come up with voluntary acts of penance on their own and offer them to God. He points out that many saints in the history of the church performed acts of mortification and they can serve as inspirations and examples.

A purpose of the upcoming Ecumenical Council, writes Pope St. John, is to render the saving work of our Redeemer more effectively in the world. In order to bring this about, the offering up to God our sorrows and sufferings as well as following Christ's teachings of self-discipline and self-denial is advocated. John believes that everyone doing his or her part in this will make Vatican II, "which is especially concerned with the refurbishing of Christian morality, an outstanding success."

The pope then goes on to encourage his brother bishops not only to do their best in persuading the faithful entrusted to them to do acts of penance, but also lead by their own example. He imagines only good things happening if all Christians were to heed his plea for prayer and self-denial in preparation for the Council. The encyclical concludes with John expressing his hope that, if his brother bishops come to Rome for the Council filled with these spiritual riches, a new era for the Catholic Church throughout the world will begin.

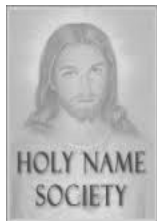
