Dear Friends,

A second collection is being taken up at all the Masses this weekend at the request of the archdiocese to assist the victims of Hurricane Florence. Thank you in advance for your generosity.

The Rosary Society's next Holy Hour will be Wednesday, October 17 at 7:00 PM. The Holy Hour will be in honor of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Our parish's annual period of Eucharistic Adoration, also known as the Forty Hours Devotion, will begin after the 10:15 AM Mass on Sunday, October 21 and conclude on Tuesday, October 23. Since it is important for at least one person to be in church while the Most Blessed Sacrament is exposed on the altar, you are encouraged to indicate the half-hour you will be able to be present before the Eucharistic Lord by signing a paper in the rear of the church. Sunday's period of adoration will end with the celebration of Mass at 5:00 PM. Evening Prayer and Benediction at 7:00 PM will conclude Monday's adoration. Forty Hours will end on Tuesday with a special prayer service and Benediction beginning at 7:00 PM.

A letter was received recently from the Catholic Foundation of Greater Philadelphia, which has charge of the Catholic Charities Appeal. The letter reads in part:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis has called for an “Extraordinary Missionary Month” to be celebrated in October 2019 with the goal of fostering an increased awareness of our baptismal call to be missionaries.
