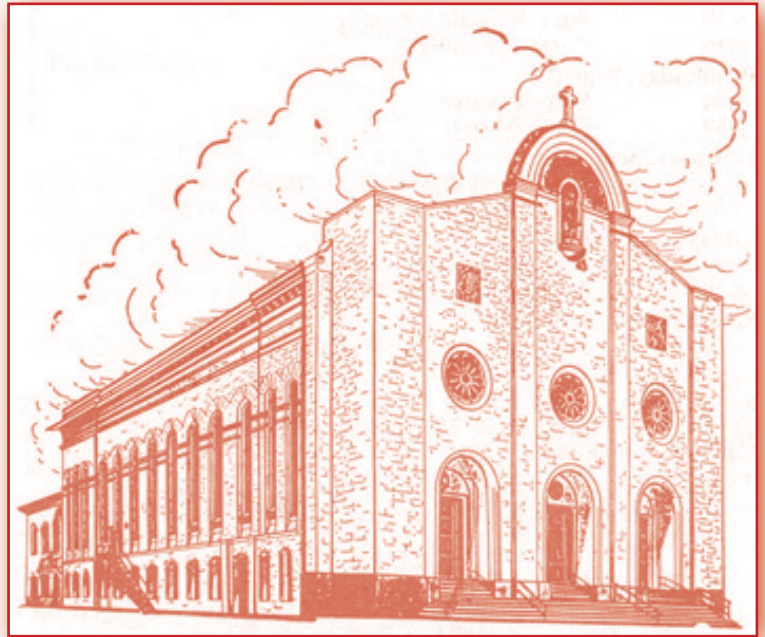

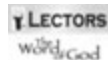

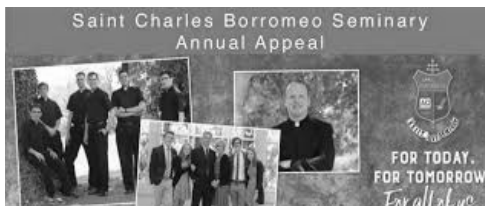

From the Pastor's Desk: "A Pilgrim's Tale:" A Bitter Winter, a bountiful Thanksgiving".

When William White, his wife Susanna and their five year old son, departed Plymouth, England on September 6, 1620 bound for the New World, they were filled with hope and dreams of a better more prosperous life. The small 100 foot ship, known as the Mayflower had one hundred and two passengers and a crew of forty. They suffered extremely cramped conditions, and the second month out, the ship encountered a terrible storm. The strong westerly gales, caused the ships timbers to be badly shaken and the caulking failed to keep out the sea water and frigid conditions which caused many passengers to become ill. This combined with a lack of proper rations and unsanitary conditions for several months, would be fatal to many, especially the women and children. But the worst was yet to come, after arriving in the New World, almost half the passengers perished in the cold, harsh unfamiliar New England winter.

But there was also hope. the arrival in the New World saw the birth of William and Susana's second son, Peregrine. That first winter also saw the death of William, Susanna now with a newborn and five years old son, become the only surviving widow out of many families to survive that first winter. By spring of 1621, half of the hundred and two original passengers were dead. Hope had seemed to abandon them. But the golden dreams and her faith in God that brought, her to is new world had not been forgotten. That fall of 1621. Susanna and her sons joined the fifty-three remaining pilgrims and some ninety native Americans to the First Thanksgiving, according to Edward Winslow, an eyewitness and the first to record the event. Susanna, who had not lost hope would go on to marry Edward and together they would have five children in addition to Susanna's 2 boys by William. The time of her death in 1647, she would live to see not only her children thrive but the colony and her dreams as well. It is easy to be thankful when everything is going our way. But to be "Thankful" really Thankful in the midst of terrible suffering and hardship and past hurts is truly a Blessing. William and Susanna's story is not just an inspiring tale of faith and hope leading to true Thanksgiving, it is also for me very personal, as William and Susanna White (passengers on the Mayflower) are my tenth great grandparents.



Seminary Appeal

Franz Frühwald is in formation in the permanent Diaconate program at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary. Franz grew up in Incarnation of Our Lord Parish in Olney and attended Cardinal Dougherty High School and then went on to La Salle University. Franz is able to put his faith into action working for the Archdiocese in the Finance Office of Catholic Social Services God willing Franz will be ordained a Permanent Deacon for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia in June of 2020. I would ask that you keep Franz and Marian in your prayers as together they travel the road toward the Permanent Diaconate. Franz will be speaking at all of the Masses at St. Anne's the weekend of November 18-19.

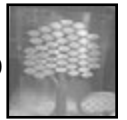
