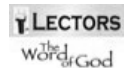

Did you know...

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:

A sacrament is an outward sign established by Jesus Christ to confer inward grace. In more basic terms, it is a “rite” (which is a ‘formal’ or ceremonial act or action) that is performed to convey God’s grace to the recipient, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is administered to bring spiritual and even physical strength during an illness, before a scheduled operation and especially but not always near the time of death. It is most likely one of the last sacraments one will receive (this is why it is often **incorrectly** called the “Last Rites”). Once received there is **no need to repeat** this sacrament especially during the same prolonged illness or situation. The grace of this sacrament continues throughout the entire illness although the ritual does allow for it’s readministration if a ‘significant and profoundly noticeable decline or change’ occurs within their condition. Like all of the sacraments which are Christ’s special gifts to His Church they should not be abused or even over-used callously but truly and faithfully received as they were intended.

The Sacrament’s Institution:

Like all the sacraments, holy anointing was instituted by Jesus Christ during his earthly ministry. The *Catechism* explains, “This sacred anointing of the sick was instituted by Christ our Lord as a true and proper sacrament of the New Testament. It is alluded to indeed by Mark, but is recommended to the faithful and promulgated by James the apostle and brother of the Lord” (CCC 1511; Mark 6:13; Jas. 5:14-15).

The anointing of the sick conveys several graces and imparts gifts of strengthening in the Holy Spirit against anxiety, discouragement, and temptation, and conveys peace and fortitude (CCC 1520). These graces flow from the atoning death of Jesus Christ, for “this was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah. ‘He took our infirmities and bore our diseases’” (Matt. 8:17).

Mark refers to the sacrament when he recounts how Jesus sent out the twelve disciples to preach, and “they cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many that were sick and healed them” (Mark 6:13). In his epistle, James says, “Is any among you sick? Let him call for the priests of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven” (Jas. 5:14-15).

The early Church Fathers recognized this sacrament’s role in the life of the Church. Around A.D. 250, Origen wrote that the penitent Christian “does not shrink from declaring his sin to a priest of the Lord and from seeking medicine....[of] which the apostle James says: ‘If then there is anyone sick, let him call the priests of the Church, and let them impose hands upon him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and if he be in sins, they shall be forgiven him’” (*Homilies on Leviticus 2:4*).

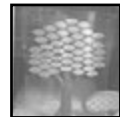

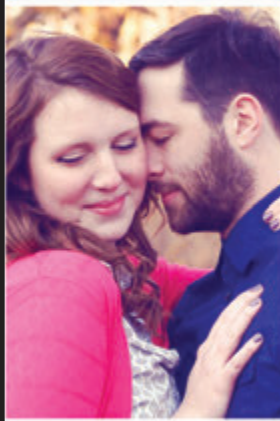

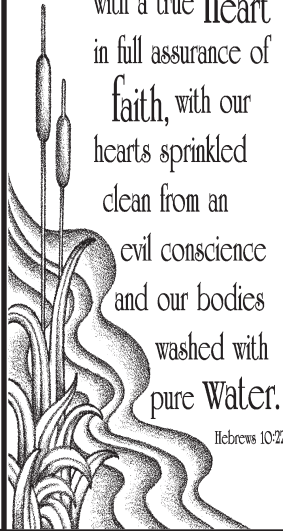
