Dear Friends,

We celebrate today one of the great feasts of the Church year, Pentecost. Our celebration commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on to the community of believers, the Church, and with that outpouring we receive the gifts that only the Spirit can give. We believe that on Pentecost, with the gift of Jesus' Spirit, the Church was born. It is very appropriate, then, that on this, of all days, we say to one another, "Happy Birthday!"

One of the gifts of the Spirit on that first Pentecost was that of being united in Jesus, and so people of different ethnic backgrounds and cultures and languages came together and understood and embraced one another through the working of the Spirit. We are told in the Acts of the Apostles (in the first reading for today) that the apostles went forth from the upper room, where they had shut themselves up with grief and fear after the death of Jesus, to proclaim to all the people in Jerusalem and beyond the praises of God. They were able to do this because of the gift of the Spirit, who filled them with courage and charity.

We at Saint Martin Parish are blessed in many ways, but one of the ways in which I believe we are most blessed is in our cultural and ethnic diversity. We are people of many backgrounds, originating in many countries, but we are truly united by the Spirit of Jesus, enabling us to become one parish, one family of faith, one communion of love. As your parochial administrator, I am able to appreciate this diversity, and to see the many ways in which all of our members share their gifts for the good of the whole. We are blessed, indeed, and we should celebrate not only our diversity, but also our unity in Christ, whose Spirit brings us together and makes us the Church he calls us to be.

There is yet another significance to this wonderful feast of Pentecost. It marks the official end of our season of Easter, which began fifty days ago on Easter Sunday (the literal meaning of the word Pentecost is "the fiftieth day"). As we move into the late spring and summer days of Ordinary Time (and the great feasts of Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi), let us not forget the Easter message of hope and encouragement and love, for this message is meant not just for the fifty days of Easter but for our entire lives as disciples of Jesus. We need to bring Jesus and his message of hope every day to the world in which we live, and thus transform the lives of everyone we meet with the same message we ourselves have received.

Know that you and those you love are daily remembered in my Mass and my prayers.

Queridos amigos,

Celebramos hoy una de las grandes fiestas del año de la Iglesia, Pentecostés. Nuestra celebración conmemora el derramamiento del Espíritu Santo sobre la comunidad de creyentes, la Iglesia, y con esa efusión recibimos los dones que solo el Espíritu puede dar. Creemos que en Pentecostés, con el don del Espíritu de Jesús, nació la Iglesia. Es muy apropiado, entonces, que en esto, de todos los días, nos decimos unos a otros: "¡Feliz cumpleaños!"

Uno de los dones del Espíritu en ese primer Pentecostés fue el de estar unidos en Jesús, por lo que las personas de diferentes orígenes étnicos, culturas e idiomas se unieron y entendieron y se abrazaron unos a otros mediante la acción del Espíritu. Se nos dice en los Hechos de los Apóstoles (en la primera lectura de hoy) que los apóstoles salieron del aposento alto, donde se habían encerrado con dolor y temor después de la muerte de Jesús, para proclamar a todas las personas de Jerusalén y más allá de las alabanzas de Dios. Pudieron hacer esto por el don del Espíritu, que los llenó de coraje y caridad.

Nosotros en la Parroquia de San Martín somos bendecidos de muchas maneras, pero una de las formas en que creo que somos más bendecidos es en nuestra diversidad cultural y étnica. Somos personas de muchos orígenes, originarios de muchos países, pero estamos verdaderamente unidos por el Espíritu de Jesús, lo que nos permite ser una sola parroquia, una familia de fe, una sola comunión de amor. Como su administrador parroquial, puedo apreciar esta diversidad y ver las muchas maneras en que todos nuestros miembros comparten sus dones para el bien de todos. En verdad, somos bendecidos, y debemos celebrar no solo nuestra diversidad, sino también nuestra unidad en Cristo, cuyo Espíritu nos une y nos hace la Iglesia que Él nos llama a ser.

Todavía hay otro significado para esta maravillosa fiesta de Pentecostés. Marca el final oficial de nuestra temporada de Pascua, que comenzó hace cincuenta días el Domingo de Pascua (el significado literal de la palabra Pentecostés es "el quincuagésimo día"). A medida que nos adentramos en los últimos días de primavera y verano del Tiempo Ordinario (y las grandes fiestas del Domingo de la Trinidad y Corpus Christi), no olvidemos el mensaje de Pascua de esperanza, aliento y amor, ya que este mensaje no solo se refiere a los cincuenta días de Pascua, pero durante toda nuestra vida como discípulos de Jesús. Necesitamos llevar a Jesús y su mensaje de esperanza todos los días al mundo en el que vivimos, y así transformar las vidas de todas las personas que encontramos con el mismo mensaje que nosotros mismos hemos recibido.
