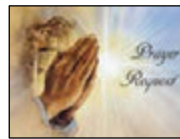

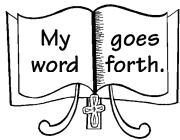

Church Debt Update: In 2005 the parish borrowed almost three and one half million dollars to build our new church, and signed a thirty year note with the Archdiocese. Two years ago we were able to refinance our loan from the original 4.5% rate down to a 2% rate, but they would only allow a two year time frame, not knowing what the banking rates would be at that time. This spring we were able to negotiate maintaining the 2% rate if we were to make a balloon payment of \$125,000. The Finance Committee agreed to use a portion of our long term savings, and lock that 2% rate. Effective this July, our debt is now down to \$448,302.00 and is scheduled to be paid in full by May 31, 2019. With your help, we have cut a thirty year note down in a fourteen year period and we are so grateful for your generosity. We are asking all families to dig a little deeper each week and contribute more to the Church Debt Collection, and maybe we can have it paid off even sooner. Thank you in advance for your support.



My dear parishioners,

Although much of our discussion of the Bible is built around explaining its meaning, dispelling apparent contradictions, and sharing insights from biblical scholars, the point of view that governs both the direction and the emphasis is that of an historian. That is my background and I believe that there is much to be gained by looking at both the Old and New Testaments from that vantage point. As always, the final conclusion is my own and I would not dare to lay the blame at the door of any one else. Historians love to tinker with past events, offer possible reconstructions, and using the rules of evidence to justify conclusions different from the mainstream. It is why history, far from being tethered to past reconstructions, interpretations, speculations, and reflections on the past through the eyes of the present, is paradoxically constantly changing.

As you will see, with the Infancy Narrative as related in the Gospel of Matthew, there are clues as to why the traditional story can be modified and why past studies may have been flawed. There are two sign posts that help us to place the birth of Jesus, the reign of the (first) Roman Emperor Augustus (27 BC to 14 AD) and that of King Herod the Great (37-4 BC). You may already notice that there is a problem with the second ruler; we will eventually get to that.

The visit of the Wise Men or Magi is mentioned in no other gospel. Where they lived, how many of them were there, let alone their names are not identified in Matthew. In sharp contrast the "unofficial" account has their names (Caspar, Bathassar, and Melchior), their place of origin as Mesopotamia, and even their present burial place, the Cathedral of Cologne, Germany. The hymn that celebrates them calls them "kings." This latter "fact" derives from the Old Testament prophecies in Ps. 72:10 and Isa. 49:7 and 60:10. Their number is derived from the three gifts mentioned and they are also viewed as representatives of the three principal human races found in the Book of Genesis. Obviously there is a good deal of symbolism in the popular picture of these mysterious visitors.

Although it is possible that they could have arrived from eastern Syria or Arabia, Mesopotamia is probably a better guess. A long tradition of astronomy dovetailed with the belief that the stars could often hold clues as to the intentions of the gods. To this day there are many people who share this belief as reflected in what is known as astrology.

Presumably these magi were pagans; no specific religion is given. The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates their arrival as marking the first time the Messiah is revealed to the Gentiles. And in many countries the Epiphany is considered more important than Christmas.

But why did these individuals conclude that the star they discovered had something to do with the Jewish people? That is not made clear. However, if they were from Mesopotamia, they most likely had contact with the large Jewish population in that region. Ever since the invasions by the Assyrians and Babylonians in the eighth and seventh centuries, large numbers of Jews had been forcibly resettled in Mesopotamia. By the first century (BC and AD) they were a sizable part of the population. We also know that as a result of the failed rebellion in 66-70, many had fled the Roman Empire to Mesopotamia, then ruled by the Parthians. When the Romans under Trajan in the early second century invaded Mesopotamia, Jewish resistance was a major cause for the Roman failure to retain possession of that area and would continue to be so for the next four centuries.
