My dear parishioners,

As with the authorship of this Gospel, the theology of Matthew helps to explain the point of view that resulted in both content and form of the gospel message. There are at least two major themes that dominate this work. The first involves the person of Jesus. Unequivocally the author asserts that Jesus is the Christ. This was the bone of contention between Jews and Christians with the latter insisting that the Messiah had come and that it was Jesus. Along with that there was Jesus’ message that the Kingdom of God was at hand. These messages are intertwined and reinforce one another.

Jesus was the Son of God and as such all authority had been given to Him by the Father. It is in the person of Jesus that both royalty and divinity come together. The use of the word “kingdom” implies a monarch, hence royalty. That this kingdom is divine is seen in the title Kingdom of God. When Peter asserts that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, it is not only Peter proclaiming this but as the representative of the church he is speaking of behalf of that as well. Even Jesus’ other title, Son of Man, harkens to prophecy of Daniel, a book that is apocalyptic as well.

Yet, at the heart of the dispute between Jewish Christians and the Jewish community at Jamnia is the role of the Torah as the Pharisees have both interpreted and developed it. Much of the Torah as it was originally is affirmed but - and this critical to the ongoing dispute - the development of the Torah as interpreted by the Pharisees is rejected. Jesus, not the Pharisees, is the new law-giver, the true successor of Moses. It was the Pharisees who added their own conclusions and extensions of the Torah and made them binding on their fellow-religionists. Jesus would confront them and declare these were made by human beings, not by God. His message, though, was approved by the Father and therefore had divine approbation.

It is this last bit that has come back to haunt ecclesiastical authorities who sought to put the binding force of divine law on human legislation. Divine law can never be overturned or suspended. Human laws can. We can and have defended some of these regulations; we can and have rescinded them in the face of being unworkable or counter-productive. That is why it is important to make the distinction now and not being forced to make a long and involved defense of church regulations that have been later repealed. It is why infallibility is rarely used in papal pronouncements.

At this point had the Jewish community in Palestine given up on the notion of a Messiah coming to save His people and restoring the autonomy and authority of the Jewish state that was the case at the time of King David? As a matter of fact, the notion of messiah was as strong as ever. Nearly a half a century after the final version of Matthew there was a massive uprising in Palestine under a charismatic leader Bar Cocchba (Kochba) that spread beyond its borders. It was far more successful than the Romans were willing to admit and was put down with great difficulty. Even today there are groups within Judaism, usually Ultra Orthodox, who look for a messiah or even have a specific person whom they honor with that title. There is even a group known as Messianic Jews who claim that they keep both Jewish law and acknowledge Jesus as the Messiah. But that is a whole other topic that I would prefer not to try to explain.

What is important is that Matthew’s Gospel addresses a running controversy with fellow Jews and at same time expands our picture of Jesus. You may want to re-read this Gospel. (190)
