My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are living on borrowed time in this world. We do not know when God will take us. Death comes unexpectedly. On this Fifth Sunday of Lent, we are reminded of the shortness of life, the reality of death that literally can come "like a thief in the night."

We are accountable to God for what we do in our lifetime. And there is an appointed hour when we will come face to face with our Lord. Jesus tells us today how to truly live: "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life." Our finest hour is when we can come before God and are able to say: "Mission accomplished, Lord. I have served and I have loved!"

There isn't much we can say when a loved one dies. Words will never be enough. We take comfort in what Jesus says in the Scriptures about a grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies and produces much fruit. We can never know what is in a man's heart, nor can we judge. We can never fully understand the unconditional love God has for each of us.

Has something died in your life? Has something gone wrong? Is the fire or spark gone between you and your loved ones? It is time to invite the Lord into your heart, into your home, into your relationships. He wants to come in, but many times we shut Him out, and that is when troubles and problems come up. One of our finest hours is when we realize our helplessness, and in humility acknowledge our need for God. Unless and until we do that, we will continue on the road of selfishness and self-fulfillment that does not bring us to the road of true life and, ultimately, to eternal life.

This Lent, let us pray that when our final hour comes, we may become recipients of His mercy and unimaginable love! There are many hours of death before we come to that final hour. We die a thousand deaths before we finally die. Let us not die before our time comes, nor by our sinning, or giving up on people, our goodness, or life itself. Let's not wait for the "last two minutes" before we come out with our finest moments and our finest hour. Let's not wait to be fined! Let's not delay our conversion, and let's not hold off our loving. Yes, let's all capture the moment, seize the day, and live in such a way that we will have no regrets whatsoever.

Our Blessed Mother teaches us to take the road of humility, obedience, and self-denial. When we take that road, we may become the "Biggest Losers" in the eyes of this world. But in the end, we turn out to be the biggest gainers after all. Remember, what matters most is not what we hold in our hands but what we carry in our hearts. What will matter then is the love in our hearts and the mercy of God.

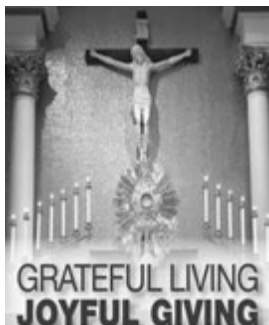


