## *From the Desk of the Pastor . . .*

This week, on May 31, we celebrate the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. What a beautiful scene and witness of generosity as Mary went “in haste” to help her cousin who was advanced in age and was expecting her 1<sup>st</sup> child. I was listening to the Jennifer Fulwiler show on Catholic Radio on SiriusXM talk about the challenges and difficulties mothers and dads face today in caring for their children. Jennifer, a mother of 6, shared about the family and societal structures that helped moms and dads in decades past care for their children, as well as support these moms, dads and their families. Often people were more likely to live near their families or other relatives that they could give one another help and support. People were more likely to know their neighbors so they would be a support system of friends to encourage and learn from one another, as well as help watch one another’s children. Neighborhoods were safer which allowed your children to go out and play because your neighbors, as well as older children were those extra set of eyes to watch and monitor what your children were up to. Each generation of parents has their challenges in raising their children and so that is the point of this column. As we remember the Blessed Virgin Mary travelling 90 miles by foot, while pregnant to help her older cousin who was with her 1<sup>st</sup> child it begs us the question of how can we support our younger families in our parish and neighborhoods as they raise their children? At the other end of the spectrum and in between, how can we support our older parishioners and their needs? Often all these groups (families and elderly) may feel more and more isolated, lacking the emotional and psychological encouragement and the physical support they need. How can we be a support system for one another? Even the simplest of things can make a difference to support one another such as visiting one another, offering to watch or have their teenagers watch their children or bringing over something for a couple that just had a child (a meal, some new or used clothing or other things they may need). With those that are older or may have little family it could be visiting them, inviting them over for a meal, a holiday gathering or picnic or running errands or taking them to appointments. It takes effort and energy to help others and we often today are more likely to isolate ourselves from helping others. Jesus in His ministry followed the example of His Mother, Mary in helping those in need and calling us to do the same. We are our brother and sister’s keeper. How is God calling us to be generous with our time and energy with others?

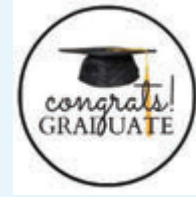

**THE CALM BEFORE THE STORM**

This seventh Sunday of Easter is somewhat like the proverbial “calm before the storm.” The Lord Jesus has ascended into heaven and Pentecost has not yet occurred.
