

**LETTERS OF ELIGIBILITY:** A letter of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, Confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Arrangements are made in advance at the Parish Office. Contact the Parish Office to obtain a copy of the Baptismal guidelines and information on scheduling.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** Arrangements must be made with the priest at least six months prior to the date of the wedding. This is to allow adequate preparation for this Sacrament. Pre-Cana classes or Engaged Encounter Weekends are required. Contact the Parish Office to obtain information on arrangements.

**SACRAMENT OF THE SICK/HOMEBOUND:** We urge all parishioners who are seriously ill or facing surgery to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick prior to admission to the hospital.

**MINISTERS OF COMMUNION** bring Holy Communion to those confined to their home. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.



## A Message from Father Rossi . . .

### Brothers and Sisters in Christ –

The readings for this Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent focus on God's faithfulness in drawing us closer to the Lord. The first reading tells how God inspired Cyrus to allow the chosen people to worship once again in Jerusalem. And in the Gospel passage, we hear of Jesus' conversation with Nicodemus, where Jesus explains that the Savior was sent to us by the Father, out of the boundless love of God. This Fourth Sunday, called "Laetare" Sunday from the Antiphon used as an entrance psalm, presents a profound reflection on the themes of longing for restoration, God's mercy and grace, the dichotomy between light and darkness, and God's unwavering love for humanity. These readings invite us to contemplate our own lives considering God's enduring patience and willingness to forgive. They challenge us to recognize our transgressions yet reassure us of the possibility of repentance and returning to God's grace. Through the narrative of the Babylonian exile and the words of our Lord in John 3, we are reminded of the transformative power of belief and the hope that will come on Resurrection Sunday, Easter.


On this Sunday, I reflect on the words of Bishop Barron from "Word on Fire". The readings focus on the Divine Love of God. They are a hymn of praise of the modes of God's love. We cannot project onto God our subjectivity. We can fall "into and out of" love...we are fickle and vacillating in love. God loves us through all things. He is Eternal and never changes. He does not fall out of emotional states as we do. He is always Merciful - God is tender in showing mercy - "*Hesed*" in the Hebrew. He is always faithful in mercy...But does not the God of the Old Testament seem unmerciful and unjust? Looking at 1 and 2 Chronicles - this book is a sweeping history of God's people of Judaism, after the construction of the temple in Jerusalem. They polluted temple worship, the place of "right praise" for God. "*Early and often did God send messengers, because He had compassion on His people*"...the prophets were sent to bring the errant back to His mercy. The Jews mocked the messengers and scoffed at His mercy - the people of the First Covenant refused his love. God, who always loves, "got angry with the people". God is Love always, but like a good parent He wishes to set us aright as His children. He destroys the nation to set things back to where they should be...drastic measures were necessary to excise the disease of sin and false worship of ancient Israel. The calamity of the destruction of the Temple by the Babylonians was terrible for the people - it was not simply a cultural issue, or political. It was a deeply religious event in their history with the Creator who is God. This destruction was viewed by the faithful as a purifying chastisement. It was an expression of God the Father who wished His children to set on the right path. We all experience terrible events in our lives - are these events simply dumb suffering - that God has abandoned His children? This is not simply Divine Anger, but an expression of God's purifying action of Love. Wishing to restore His children back to God's love, He chose to permit Babylon to conquer Israel. Later King Cyrus, who conquered Babylon, would release the Jews back to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem. This event demonstrates that God is consistently faithful to the people of God's tender mercy - the Jewish nation. God chastises to bring us back into relationship with Himself. God wishes to give everything to us in love — this is the Gospel passage. "God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, so that all might have eternal life" through the Passion and Death of Jesus on the Cross...this act of love is the Incarnation - the fleshing over of God on earth. God wishes to lift us out of the mud of our human sinfulness and struggle - so that we might be raised UP into eternity - into the eternal aspect of Triune Love in Heaven. St. Paul speaks to this aspect today: "*This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich God is in grace.*"

May we embrace the tender mercy of God, accepting the Crosses in our lives, for the greater glory to see Him face-to-face in Eternity with the Spirit and the Son. Amen!


