Pastor's Page

We have another passage today from the Prophetic Books of the Old Testament, this week from Amos. If at first glance, the prophets seem all alike, it is for good reason: they were concerned about the same things. They called Israel and Judah to remember God who saved them, made a covenant with them, who wanted them to return to it and be a blessing to the nations. The prophet's language and symbolic actions said long ago what still needs saying today.

In other ways, the prophets were not alike. Their personalities, backgrounds, ways of speech and actions were very different. We can learn many different lessons from our hearing their words, which ultimately are the Word of God they are relating. Remember, the root meaning of the word "prophet" is one who speaks out.

Amos is a shepherd from Judah, who goes north to the northern kingdom to preach against the sinful northern kingdom of Israel. He really had no intention of becoming a prophet, he was a shepherd and a tender of sycamore trees. He did not even live in Israel (northern kingdom), he lived in Judah (south). Remember the Kingdom was divided when Solomon died around 925 BC, into Israel in the north and Judah in the south.

Amos is said to be the angry prophet. He goes north and condemns unjust exploitive actions toward the poor and the weak and tells them God will punish them for this. Amos is angered by Israel's disregard for God's law, so lovingly designed to protect the people – both the poor from going hungry and the rich from becoming greedy. The law was given to Israel when it was called to be God's nation, but now Israel has become like other nations: wealth is in the hands of a few, justice has been corrupted and poor people are oppressed. Sound familiar? The book of Amos is not lengthy, one of the shorter of the writing prophetic books. I would recommend this book to your summer reading.

In Mark today, we see the Apostles, specifically the Twelve, receiving a mandate from Jesus. Like Amos, the Twelve whom Jesus sends on a mission in today's Gospel were busy about other careers before Jesus called them (Mark 1:16-20). They were set apart and received authority to preach and expel demons. Sharing in Jesus' authority they were called to follow his example.

Saint Paul in his Epistle to the Ephesians reminds all believers of the blessings they have received by virtue of our baptism: the call to holiness, divine adoption, freedom from sin by Christ's blood. We have been "blessed in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens." In praise and thanksgiving we bless God for this great gift.

Please be advised that there is a nationwide scam that has affected several parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This particular scam is titled the "Gift Card" scam.

In this scam the parishioners of a parish are the targets. An unknown person creates an e-mail address account which contains the pastor's name or the name of the church. An e-mail is then sent to the parishioners requesting them to purchase a gift card and proceeded to tell the unknown person the numbers off of the back of the cards. After the person received the numbers, they stopped sending emails.

The Offices for Clergy suggest that a warning to your parishioners should be published in the manner you deem most appropriate.

SPONSOR GUIDELINES FOR BAPTISM/ CONFIRMATION

Church law requires that Baptism and Confirmation sponsors themselves frequent the sacraments regularly.

When someone who does not meet that requirement is designated as a sponsor, it is always an unpleasant (and frequently painful) experience for the priest, the parents of the child, and most especially for the person designated.

The reason a sponsor must be a practicing Catholic is that a sponsor is expected to pay special attention to the efforts of the person who is being baptized or confirmed to live a Christian life in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. In the case of Baptism, sponsors are also expected to assist the parents of the child in their Christian duty as parents, by offering them support through good example, encouragement and prayer.

A sponsor should be a registered parishioner of IHM for at least 6 months. The person should also have received all the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation. The Sponsor must be at least 16 years of age. The Sponsor should also participate at Mass each Sunday. If married, the sponsor must also be in a valid Sacramental marriage.

By issuing a Sponsor Certificate, a priest assures members of the faithful that a person is a Catholic in good standing who is eligible to serve as a sponsor for Baptism and/or Confirmation. Please contact the Rectory during regular business hours to inquire about Sponsor Certificates.
