YOUNG NEIGHBORS IN ACTION

Next week, 11 Resurrection youth and 3 adults will be leaving for our annual trip for the Young Neighbors in Action program. This year, we will be heading to Worcester, MA which is right outside Boston. Our assignment is working on a 10 acre organic farm by planting, harvesting, and cleaning vegetables. We will then pack up these vegetables into a truck and bring them to the Food Bank of Worcester County. Here, we will listen to a presentation about the Food Bank and how it serves the population. Finally, we will transport food to a local homeless shelter for men and meet with a resident. This resident will talk to us about his experience being homeless and how the food that we help grow and harvest affects his life.

There will be a send off Mass at 7pm on Tuesday, July 7th. Please join us as we make the final preparations for our trip. If you can not attend the send off Mass, we ask that you keep us in your prayers. The group will be out of town from July 11-18th. Thank you so much for all of your support throughout the year- you will certainly be in all of our prayers!

Sister Catherine Higley, OSB, prioress of Benedictines in Ridgely, MD, will be here July 12 to speak on behalf of monastic communities in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. Often these are in poverty areas and/ or areas suffering from the effects of civil violence or war. This is an annual collection coordinating by the Missions office of the diocese. A cousin of Fr. Graney, she grew up in St. Matthew's parish & St. Elizabeth's High School.

Did you ever have an experience that left you saying: **"Thank God someone was praying for me"**? The *National Geographic Magazine* in its June 2009 issue had a feature on Arab Christians in the Holy Land. Within that article, we can get a sense of the presence of priests and monks in the Holy Land. The role of monasteries is often to maintain a prayerful presence and support to the people in the Holy Land and around the world.

A context is given by a quote(from this feature article) from a young father of two who is still struggling to stay in the Holy Land. "It's funny," he says, "what Americans think about things. They've never heard of Arab Christians. They assume all Arabs are Muslim—terrorists, that is—and that Christianity was invented in Italy or something. So when you say, I'm an Arab Christian, they look at you funny, like you just said, The moon is purple. I had one lady ask me, 'What does your family think about you being a Christian? I suppose they must have been very upset!

Another story is of a 73 year old hermit. In his prayers he consciously goes to various continents of the world distributing blessings on them. He counts off the blessings "one by one on a string of woven rosary beads that fly through his fingers like doves." "This daily trip takes three or four hours, and most days—if he doesn't linger too long over the trouble spots—he's back home by noon. To the untrained eye, he's just an old man walking around in a garden." He belongs to a tradition of influential hermits that go back to the 5th century. Hundreds come to hear his teachings about Jesus.

"In some monasteries Christians still prostrate themselves in prayer—a Byzantine-era practice that early Muslims may have admired and adopted. Some churches still conduct services in Aramaic or Syriac, languages that predate Islam."

Hopefully, this gives you a sense of the good of monasteries which we will be invited to financially support in the second collection on July 11-12. Thanks in advance for your understanding and support.

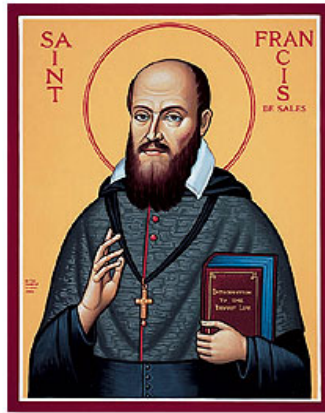
