Catechetical News

Congratulations to the children from our parish who received *the Sacrament of Reconciliation* for the first time on Saturday, February 10th! We will keep you in prayer as you continue to prepare for First Holy Communion.

Our next **Confirmation Class** will take place on Sunday, March 18th starting at the Noon Mass and concluding at 4:00 p.m.

There will be a **Parent and Child Meeting** for those preparing for the Sacrament of First Holy Communion on March 7th at 4:00 or 6:00 p.m. You can choose which meeting time is more convenient for you, but both a parent and a child must attend.

ARCHDIOCESE OF NEWARK 2018 REGULATIONS

1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. The law of abstinence obliges those who have reached the age of 14. *There is no maximum age for abstinence.*

2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence “substantially”, or as a whole, is a serious obligation.

3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, February 18th, to the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, May 27th.

*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

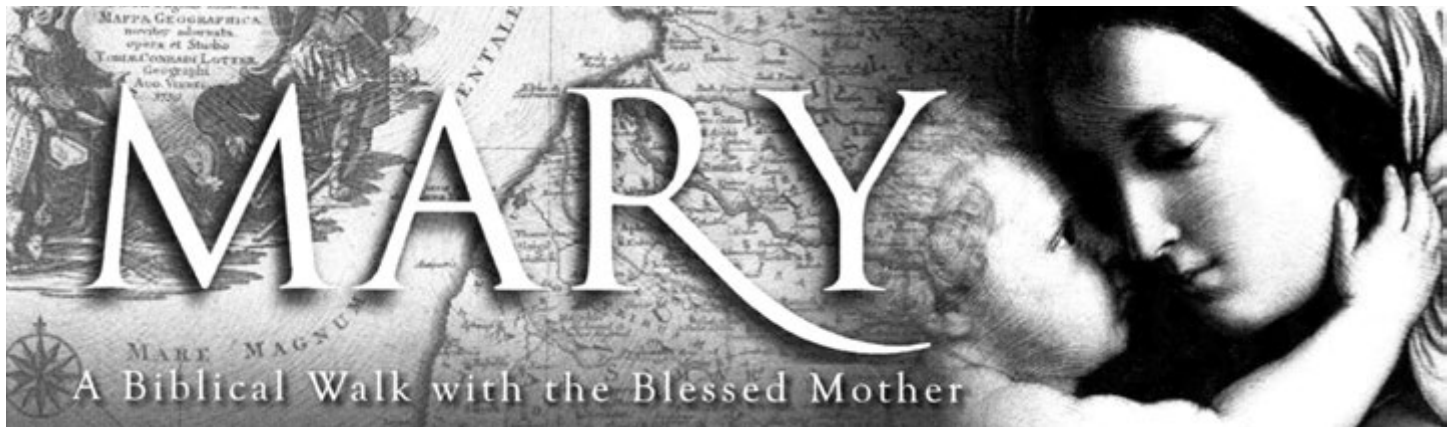
