A Catholic Philosophy of Life – Three remaining lectures given by Msgr. Richard Liddy, *Director of the Center for Catholic Studies at Seton Hall University*. The lectures will take place on three Thursdays in the Summer at 7:00 p.m.; June 28th, July 5th and August 2nd – and will take place at Stafford Hall at Seton Hall.

All of us live by some philosophy, whether we know it or not. These four lectures will present a Catholic vision of life inspired by the work of Bernard Lonergan, S. What are we for? Is there a God? Is there 'grace' that heals and redeems us?*"
