We Are Living Stones News

As we all know, 50% of all the money raised in the ongoing Archdiocesan Capital Campaign **We Are Living Stones** was returned to the parishes. We named several Projects that would be undertaken here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help with the money we received from our participation in this campaign. One of these has been completed and two are now underway:

The project to install **Vinyl Soffits** on our Church House is finished this past week and our Church House looks great!

Another project we cited was the **Asphalt** behind the Church House. This area has been in terrible condition for too long with gaping holes in the asphalt as well as very poor drainage. The drainage issue has been addressed with perforated pipes installed to allow water drainage under the grassy area that borders Franklin Avenue. A cement pad for the repositioned dumpsters has been installed and if the asphalt is not already poured - it will be any day now! This project is costing the Parish \$22,600.00. Contractor: F. Antonucci and Sons, Inc.

Another project we cited was new outside doors in the hallway that connects the two sections of the School Building. The current doors cannot be locked and are somewhat of a security risk because of that. Victor Zucchi and Sons will be replacing these doors for us. Cost of the project: \$10,878.00.
