Scripture Reflection

John 6:51-58

John’s Gospel does not have an Institution Narrative but instead this Bread of Life Discourse that we have been reading for three Sundays now. Today’s reading is especially important because in it Jesus drives home the truth of the Real Presence – He is truly present, Body and Blood, soul and divinity – in the Eucharist. To eat His flesh and drink His blood means nothing short of having eternal life.

Imagine Jesus saying these words to you. What would your response be?

The Eucharist both recalls Jesus’ sacrificial death and makes Him present to us in a real and tangible way.

How could I possibly live without that?

The important words in today’s reading are: bread, flesh, blood, life, eat, and drink. Read through this gospel passage a few times and pray these words.
