## Fourth Sunday of Lent

From the first days of creation, humans took advantage of their free will and sinned against God. But God so loved the world that God sent the Son to be born into the world, to suffer and die to atone once and for all for our sins, and to be raised up so that all may have eternal life. The Holy Spirit draws us here each week to allow us to express our love for God in the way that we worship God and the way that we treat each other. On this Laetare ("Rejoice!") Sunday, we are reminded of God's unparalleled love and mercy and ultimate purpose for us all.
Reading I: 2 Chronicles 36: 14-16, 19-23
A reflection on the evil of not paying attention to God's prophets compels the Israelites to endure a 70 year exile in Babylon.

## Reading II: Ephesians 2: 4-10

St. Paul tells Christians that they can be identified with Christ in that they too will be enthroned with Him in heaven. The Gospel: John 3: 14-21
The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus continues with a discussion about God sending His only Son to earth to bring light and love to the world.

## Scripture Note

Our readings today invite us to make a choice. Centuries before Christ, the people of Judah chose to turn away from God, and Jerusalem was allowed to be destroyed. But the psalmist pleaded that the people never forget the holy city. Jesus tells Nicodemus that those who prefer darkness to light condemn themselves, but those who live in the truth come to the light, where we can do the good works that Paul says flow from God's grace. May God's word inspire us to live in the truth of our faith, where God offers us everlasting mercy and love.

Let us, therefore, make a COVENANT of prayer and renewal as we walk our Lenten journey and draw closer to the joy of Easter. Here is a list of opportunities for formal prayer during liturgy and elsewhere. May we "change our hearts this time" as the Lord calls us to "come back to me with all your heart."

Fasting Regulations
The Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE from all meat. The law binds those who are 14 and older. We understand FASTING as partaking of ONE main meal and two lesser meals. The law of fasting binds those who are between 18 and 59. Both FASTING and ABSTINENCE are to be observed on both Ash Wednesday AND Good Friday.


Traditionally the church has promoted the Lenten season as a time of prayer and fasting. We usually interpret fasting with the emphasis on food and drink.

However, Pope Francis in his directive gives us a much deeper meaning of fasting.

* Fast from hurting words and say kind words
* Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude
* Fast from anger and be filled with patience
* Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope
* Fast from worries and have trust in God
* Fast from complaints and contemplate simplicity
* Fast from pressures and be prayerful
* Fast from bitterness and fill your hearts with joy
* Fast from selfishness and be compassionate to others
* Fast from grudges and be reconciled
* Fast from words and be silent so you can listen.

During the Mass we dismiss our children in grades Kindergarten-Third, along with their adult catechists, to take part in the Sunday Scripture at their level. Terminology at the appropriate age level helps the children to understand and appreciate the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. In the past we have noted that children who attend Mass and participate in the Liturgy of the Word for Children have a more complete understanding of their Catholic education, and are more prepared for their celebration of the Sacraments. This is a required preparation for those receiving the Eucharist for the first time.
