## REFLECTIONS FOR OCTOBER 22, 2017

### First Reading: Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

The enthronement of Cyrus marks the only time in the Old Testament when a foreigner is anointed king. In this text, God is announcing that He is the one and only Lord.

### Second Reading: I Thessalonians 1:1-5b

The Letter opens with the typical form of salutation of the day. Then Paul proceeds to thank God for the fruitful reception of the Gospel by the Thessalonian Christians.

### Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

The Pharisees try entrapment to get at Jesus. This is still a legal offense in our modern courts. Jesus outwits them with a classic answer. Doing so, He accepts the state as the lesser of two evils while He looks to nonviolent social change.

This will be one of the ways in which we will honor and pray for the dead throughout the month of November. The pictures will remain in the Church for the whole month as a reminder to us that we are all part of the Communion of Saints, both here on earth and in the heavenly kingdom. You may take the pictures back home with you the week of November 26<sup>th</sup> just before the season of Advent begins.

He went on to father twins and to write and direct films for which he received numerous awards - all while being totally paralyzed! The book will provide fertile ground for discussing the meaning of life as well as the topic of euthanasia, a relevant topic in our society today.

**CONFIRMATION IS NOT A SACRAMENT OF MATURITY IN THE FAITH NOR DOES IT IMPLY AN ADULT COMMITMENT TO THE FAITH.**

For quite some time, many Catholics have referred to the sacrament of Confirmation as kind of a rite of passage in the faith. Confirmation is, and has always been, a sacrament of initiation, not transition or graduation.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says this: "Although Confirmation is sometimes called the 'sacrament of maturity,' we must not confuse adult faith with the adult age of natural growth...St. Thomas reminds us of this: Age of body does not determine age of soul. Even in childhood one can attain spiritual maturity." (CCC 1308)

We do not confirm our faith in the sacrament of Confirmation. It is not about what we do, but it is about the work of God. Go to [www.catholicnh.org/lifelong](http://www.catholicnh.org/lifelong) for more information on sacrament of Confirmation.

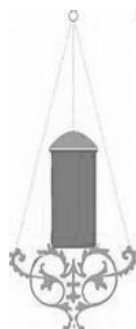
