REFLECTIONS FOR MAY 20, 2018

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The miraculous Pentecost event, as presented by St. Luke, is rich in drama and literal "wind and fireworks." The sudden gift to the Apostles of being able to be understood in many languages clearly shows the presence of the Holy Spirit empowering the nascent Church.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Paul responds to the Corinthians' problem of competitiveness in their community, which is harming their unity. He tells them that all spiritual gifts bring benefits in different ways. He uses the analogy of the human body and its various parts working in harmony.

Gospel: John 14:15-6, 23b-26

Jesus makes a set of promises to all believers. He also tells them that the Father will be sending another Advocate to them, namely the Holy Spirit. He in turn will instruct the Church, guiding her to keep the message Jesus brought intact throughout history.

COMMUNAL CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

At the noon Mass on Sunday, June 3rd we will celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In this Sacrament, the Church continues Jesus' ministry of care, compassion and healing, and upholds the fundamental truth that human dignity is not lost through frailty or illness. During the blessing of the oil of the sick at the Chrism Mass each year, we pray that all who are anointed with the oil will be "freed from pain and illness, and made well again in body, mind and soul".

Who is this Sacrament meant for? Although for some time previously the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick had been thought of as something intended only for people at the very point of death, the Second Vatican Council restored the ancient meaning of the Sacrament as a liturgical celebration designed for **anyone who is seriously ill, and especially those who are in danger of death from illness or old age**. It is also an important opportunity for parishioners who are not ill to join in prayer with those who are in need of healing.

We invite all to join us for this Sacramental celebration, and for fellowship in the church hall following the Mass. If you know of anyone who would like to participate and who is in need of a ride, or if you would like to volunteer to provide a ride, please contact Lisa Laurence at 548-5130.

VITA ET CARITAS AWARD**

The Diocese of Manchester is currently seeking nominations for the Vita et Caritas Award (For Life and Love Award), given to a volunteer of a non-profit organization who makes significant contributions that help transform the lives of women, children and families. The non-profit organization will also receive a \$2,500 grant. The recipient will be honored on September 6th at the annual Bishop’s Summer Reception, celebrating the success of the Bishop’s Charitable Assistance Fund campaign.

This annual award is given in honor of the memory of Ruthie Ford, whose life reflected Catholic ideals and tireless dedication to service in the cause of helping women, children and families. 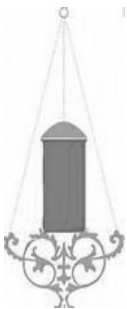


