REFLECTIONS FOR MARCH 18, 2018

These readings come from Cycle A in the Lectionary as these are the readings used for the Scrutinies for R.C.I.A.

First Reading: Ezekiel 37:12-14

The prophet preaches the word of God to bring new life to a dead Israel. God will take the initiative and send His very Spirit to give this life.

Second Reading: Romans 8:8-11

Paul names "pleasing God" as the goal of human life. This is possible only if God's Spirit is in us. That Spirit makes our future resurrection possible.

Gospel: John 11:1-45, or 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45

Jesus proves that the Father hears Him. Moreover, He has given Jesus the power of life over death, which is displayed by the miracle of Lazarus' raising.

ST. JUDE PARISH TRIP IN AUGUST, 2020

St. Jude Parish has established a trip that will be take place from August 14th through August 22nd, 2020. It is a tour featuring the once every 10 year Passion Play of Our Lord held in Oberammergau, Germany. The trip will include Munich, Salzburg, and Vienna as well.

A little about Oberammergau: In 1634, the Black Death decimated Europe, including almost 100 deaths in Oberammergau. The remaining villagers vowed that, if God saved them from the plague, once every 10 years they would reenact the Agony and Death of Jesus Christ. From then on, there were no further deaths from the plague, and the villagers have fulfilled their promise ever since. The play itself portrays the Passion of Jesus Christ – from His entry into Jerusalem to The Resurrection. The play consists of more than 2,000 actors, singers, musicians, and technicians. The Passion Play Theater is an open-air stage framed by magnificent Alpine scenery and a covered auditorium with almost 5,000 seats. There will be an information night on Wednesday, April 4th, 2018 at 7:00PM in the Parish Hall.

RESPECTFUL DISPOSAL OF SACRAMENTALS

The proper disposal of votive candles, rosaries (which sometimes break), medals, palm branches, and other misc. religious items and devotionals, if they have been blessed, is to burn or to bury them. In the case of candles, let the candles burn down entirely or, if this presents a hazard should the glass candle holders break, burn them by themselves.

It is not a sin to throw away blessed items but, out of proper respect, one should dispose of them in this way. If devotionals have not been blessed, such as some of the holy cards and such that come through the mail, those are simply pictures and can be thrown away. If you feel uncomfortable throwing them away, you can burn them as well.

You may also check with local Catholic cemeteries as they sometimes will bury your sacramental items in burial plots.

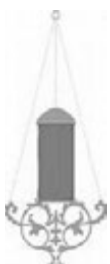
