FROM THE PASTOR

This past week, the parish had an official visit from the Dean of our deanery, Fr. Tom Whittingham. These visits happen every few years as an opportunity to review parish records, tour the campus, and get a sense of the state of the parish: strengths, challenges, areas for improvement, etc. Different offices from the archdiocese contribute reports as well to paint a picture of Holy Cross.

I'm happy to say that the visit was a success. While we do face plenty of challenges as a parish, the feedback I received is that we are honest and realistic about them, and we are working to manage and address them as best as we can under the circumstances. I was happy to hear that. It's a recognition of and testimony to the hard work that our staff and volunteer leaders put into keeping the parish going. I do want to point out that we received a positive review of our sacramental and other parish records. Lastly, I am proud to say that the Office of Child and Youth Protection for the Archdiocese wrote a letter that said we are doing an excellent job following the various protocols and standards to ensure the safety and protection of the children of our parish. As Father said to me, they don't give out compliments very often, so we are definitely doing something right there! Thank you to Betty McIntyre for her hard work keeping on top of all that.

Don't forget this Saturday is our school's Night at the Races event! It looks to be a great evening of fun and excitement. But it won't be fun if you're not there, so please plan to join us.

An early note for next week. From April 29-May 2, the priests of the archdiocese will be gathering with the Archbishop for our biennial convocation in Hershey. We'll be taking a deep look at the state of the archdiocese and the strategic planning being done as we face a continuing shortage of priests and the effects of the demographic shifts that have happened in the last generation. Because most of the priests of the archdiocese will be away, there will be no Mass here at Holy Cross on April 30, May 1, or May 2.
