

BACKGROUND on the GOSPEL

The fourth Sunday of Lent is sometimes called *Laetare* Sunday. *Laetare* is a Latin word that means “rejoice.” Traditionally, Sundays are named after the first word of the liturgy’s opening antiphon. On this Sunday, the antiphon is taken from the book of the prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 66:10-11). Even as we observe our Lenten sacrifices, we rejoice in anticipation of the joy that will be ours at Easter.

Today’s Gospel reading is taken from John’s Gospel. It consists of two parts. The first part is the final sentence of Jesus’ reply to Nicodemus, the Pharisee who approached Jesus at night.

Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Nicodemus misunderstood Jesus at every point, but there was no animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

In the part of the conversation with Nicodemus in today’s Gospel, Jesus referred to an incident reported in the Old Testament. When the Israelites grumbled against the Lord during their sojourn in the desert, God sent venomous serpents to punish them for their complaints. The Israelites repented and asked Moses to pray for them. The Lord heard Moses’ prayer and instructed him to make a bronze serpent and mount it on a pole. All who had been bitten by a serpent and then looked upon the bronze serpent were cured. By recalling this story, Jesus alludes to the salvation that would be accomplished through his death and Resurrection.

The second part of today’s Gospel is a theological reflection on Jesus’ words to Nicodemus. The Gospel of John is known for this kind of reflection offered within the narrative. The words of the Evangelist are in continuity with the words of the prologue to John’s Gospel. In these reflections, John elaborates on a number of themes that are found in his Gospel: light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation.

In John’s reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. Jesus is the light that has come into the world, but people preferred the darkness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God. Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.



Parish Theme for the Church Year 2023-24 – The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life.

From the Pastor

Laetare Sunday – This Fourth Sunday of Lent is traditionally referred to as Laetare Sunday. “Laetare” is the Latin word for “Rejoice.” Lent is a time when we focus on taking up our cross and following the Lord, a time of uniting ourselves to Christ in his passion and suffering. This fourth Sunday of Lent emphasizes joy to remind us that bearing the cross, accepting the sacrifices in following Jesus, is the path to new life and a deeper joy. We are not defeated by the cross but the Lord leads us through it to a greater share in his life, peace and joy.

Adult Faith Formation Sessions on the Eucharist – In conjunction with the Eucharistic Revival called for by the bishops of the United States, we are currently offering a Lenten series on the Eucharist. This week there will be an evening session on Wednesday, March 13 at 7 pm in the Antioch Annex.

Fish Fry – The Knights of Columbus are hosting a fish fry in the Antioch Annex on Friday evening, March 22, at 6:30 pm. Come and enjoy a meal and the company of your fellow parishioners as we observe the abstinence from meat on Fridays in Lent.

Catholic Charities Appeal – The 2024 Appeal is underway. Make your donation online at catholiccharitiesappeal.org, or use the envelope you received at home. Also, additional envelopes are in the vestibule of Church. Your donations help the Archdiocese to meet the needs of many poor people in our area and help to spread the message of the gospel.

CHURCH TEACHING

Eucharistic Revival – We are currently in the second year of a three-year Eucharistic Revival called for by the Bishops of the United States. The following is from a booklet entitled “From Mass to Mission” by Trish Sullivan Vanni.

The Name for the Mass – We give the Mass many names. The word “Mass” itself comes from the Latin word “missa,” which means “mission.” At the end of the Mass, the priest or deacon dismisses us to go out into the world with a very important task: “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” What we pray at Mass is an English translation of some Latin texts. If we attended a Mass in Latin, the priest would dismiss us with the phrase, “Ite, missa est.” Literally translated, this means, “Go, she (the Church) has been sent.” And so, what we call this entire celebration – Mass – actually means “mission.” What we do at Mass is so important that it affects how we live in the world.

The Mass is often referred to as the liturgy. The word “liturgy” is from the Greek Word “leitourgia,” which means “the work of the people.” The Mass is not the work of one person – the priest – but the entire community that is worshipping God.

Located in Southeast Asia between the Pacific and Indian Oceans, Indonesia has beautiful beaches, diverse cultures and nearly 280 million people—the fourth highest population in the world!

Many of the country's more than 17,000 islands are in the Ring of Fire, a region around the rim of the Pacific Ocean where volcanic eruptions and earthquakes are common. Climate-related disasters such as cyclones also threaten the islands and are becoming more frequent and destructive.

Strong rains and wind from these storms—combined with long periods without rain, called drought—make it difficult for people like Evita Tiro Wada to grow food. Evita and her family live on Flores Island, where she keeps a home garden for food and income.

To help her family and community become more resilient against natural disasters and have more reliable access to food, Evita participated in a Catholic Relief Services' program, through which she joined a disaster preparedness group.

The group helps their community stay safe during emergencies like cyclones and earthquakes. They created a system to warn people to evacuate and identified evacuation routes, assembly points and resources they can use during a crisis.

The group also maintains a community garden. They grow vegetables like beans, eggplant and water spinach to provide healthy food for their families. They use a drip irrigation system that conserves water so the vegetables can grow even during a drought. Evita and her group members use the garden to teach people from other communities how to start their own.

To protect their garden from the wind and prevent erosion from the ocean waves, Evita and her group planted trees. They also cleaned up the river and other areas in their town by picking up trash, which helped prevent flooding.

Evita says, "When I first joined the village disaster preparedness group, I thought, 'What will I do or give to help the community?' After I've been involved, I see the benefits of what the community and I did."

REGISTRATION

A warm welcome is extended to new parishioners. You may register by calling the parish office during office hours to set up an appointment. Parish registration is required for letters of eligibility to serve as godparent or sponsor.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 pm. Arrangements must be made in advance at the Rectory by calling Msgr. Dougherty, ext. 112. If parents have not attended a Baptism class, they must attend our Baptism Preparation Seminar. Call the rectory to register for the class. Godparents guidelines state that one godparent must be Catholic. They must be at least 16 years of age, registered in the parish where they live, fully initiated, and practicing their faith; they must obtain a letter of eligibility from their own parish. One practicing non-Catholic Christian may also be admitted as a Christian Witness. [The next Baptism Preparation Seminar will be Thursday, March 14, 2024 at 7 PM in the rectory.](#)

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Those who wish to marry at St. Margaret should contact Msgr. Dougherty. The Sacrament of Marriage is celebrated after a period of preparation of not less than six months. REQUESTS FOR ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATES

The Role of a sponsor is primarily a spiritual role to model a Christian life for the child. Therefore, anyone requesting a certificate must be a registered, participating member of St. Margaret Parish, a practicing Catholic in good standing, at least 16 years of age, and have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist). Please call or email the rectory for an appointment with Msgr. Dougherty if you need a certificate.

In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory to make arrangements. If someone is already in the hospital, be sure to register as a Catholic so that the priest will visit.
