

WEDDING INFORMATION

Wedding Planning begins with engaged couple's meeting a parish priest here at least six (6) months before desired wedding date. Please do <u>not</u> make financial commitments before confirming church date/time. If a member of the couple was previously married, a <u>Declaration of Nullity</u> (*Annulment*) of the prior marriage may be necessary. Please contact parish priest for detailed information.

MARRIAGE CONVALIDATION: Couples in a civil or non-Catholic religious union without our Church's explicit permission are not in a valid Catholic marriage. They cannot receive other sacraments or serve as Catholic Sponsors for Baptism and Confirmation. This situation is often easily remedied by "convalidation", a simple ceremony popularly called "getting a marriage blessed". Call Parish Office to arrange.

BAPTISM INFORMATION

Before date is confirmed, parents must have/obtain:

- Registration in SJB Parish: Family from another parish must obtain written permission from "home" parish for Baptism at SJB.
- <u>Certificate of Eligibility to Serve as Sponsor</u>:
 Each <u>Catholic Sponsor</u> (1 required; 2 preferred) must obtain <u>Certificate of Eligibility</u> from "home" parish. Parishes generally do not issue certificates to persons not already registered nor to persons who left the parish more than <u>6</u> months previously.
- Letter from Pastor for Christian Witness:
 One baptized non-Catholic may serve as a Christian Witness and must present Letter of Good Standing from current Christian pastor. A Catholic not eligible to Sponsor may not be Christian Witness.
 Call Parish Office to arrange.

Penance) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in His love
and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed

and mercy to oner sinners forgiveness for offenses committee against God. At the same time sinners reconcile with the Church who is also wounded by our sins.

Confessions will be heard on the First Friday of each month here at SJB before morning Mass. Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us that Confession is an act of hopesty and courses and courses are Confession is an act of honesty and courage, an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving and forgiving God."



We welcome Catholics with Celiac Disease to the Table of the Lord. Low-gluten Communion hosts are available at all weekend liturgies to those suffering from Celiac Sprue disease. When you arrive for Mass, go to the Sacristy. Let the Sacristan EUCHARIS know that you will need a low-gluten host. The low-gluten hosts are consecrated at the same time as the regular hosts. When you reach the Presider during the Communion Procession, whisper to him that you will need to receive a low-gluten host.

Looking for a good book to read for Lent? It's Never Too Late to Start: A Lenten Book List. The season of Lent is an ideal time to grow in the spiritual life. Make the most of your

Lenten experience with this book suggestion: Throughout the centuries, Christians have asked, "Why is there suffering?" or, on a more personal level, "Why am I suffering?" Answers abound, but none are likely to suffice or satisfy. A far more helpful question might be, "How should I respond to suffering?" And the answer to that question,



believes Gary Jansen, can be found by looking closely at the Passion of Jesus. In Station to Station, Jansen uses the scriptural Way of the Cross to focus our minds & hearts on Jesus' anguish & death. Walking through each station, we see the unique ways in which Jesus responded to suffering & we are challenged to react similarly in our own struggles. Furthermore, through various Ignatian exercises, Jansen encourages us to imaginatively pray our way through the stations & to gradually respond more as Jesus would when we are weighed down by life's burdens. Whether you are bearing your own cross or helping someone else carry theirs, Station to Station will show you how Christ's character in the midst of suffering can, with time & prayer, become your character too.

Please stop by the table in the main Vestibule during Lent and check out the Classic Paper Prayer Chain Garland, Each strip has a blank side for you to write your prayer intentions. Submit prayer requests to Jesus Christ the Risen Lord! Your request will be lifted in prayer! The prayer chain will be draped around a cross during the Easter Season. So let's join with each other and pray! PRAYER WORKS!

Christ, the bread of life, fed the multitudes while on earth & today continues to nourish us spiritually through the Eucharist. This Lent, we reflected on how the Eucharist unites us with God & one another as members of the same body of Christ & how the




Lord invites us to see him in our global family. We saw Christ in Uganda, through Adolf & Florence, who learned new farming methods, so they can provide food for their family & help their neighbors grow better crops. We can imagine how much Jesus rejoiced when Adolf said, "I have seen my children happy because they are well fed." We saw Christ in El Salvador, in Sandra & Santos Amaya's family. Like the body of Christ, which, though one body, has many members, each family member contributes their unique gifts to support the household. We saw Christ in Sandra's sacrifices to ensure her family & community can thrive, from learning how to keep chickens to traveling long distances for training that helps her & her neighbors. We saw Christ in Indonesia, through Evita & her disaster preparedness group. Together, they have helped keep their community safe during natural disasters, which have increased & become more destructive due to climate change. We saw Christ again in the group's communal vegetable garden, which ensures their families have nutritious food even in emergencies. Lastly, we have seen Christ in you during this holy season, in your prayers, sacrifices & almsgiving. As we near Holy Week, we reflect on the Eucharist as the sacrament of unity that ignites in us the desire to get out of our comfort zone & become Jesus' hands to care for our neighbors. Let us continue to imitate Christ in how he offers himself for us on the Cross & in the Eucharist. In this way, may we generously give of ourselves to honor & uphold the dignity of our sisters & brothers around the world. Visit <u>crsricebowl.org</u> to learn more.

it not only reminds us of all that our Lord has done for us, it also reminds us that, even in the trials of life, our Lord is with us, He loves us & joy awaits us. Lent always ends with Easter.

Join SJB for Stations of the Cross in church at 7pm on 3/19 and 3/26 followed by Benediction.

You are welcome to come and join us as we take this walk – stopping at each station for prayer and meditation. This can be a moving experience for individuals or families. Please plan to prayerfully participate in this very personal walk with Jesus. Come, just as you are.



The "Liturgy of the Hours" (a.k.a. "The Divine Office" or "Breviary") is the daily prayer of the universal Church, with different "hours" prayed at various times of the day & night. It is based primarily on the Psalms, but also incorporates other biblical texts, canticles, hymns, prayers & even some non-biblical readings. The 3 "major hours" are Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer and the Office of Readings (prayed at any time during the day).

Please join us for HORNING BRAYER

on Holy Saturday, 3/30 at 10:00 am.
What is it? A brief and simple prayer
service at the start of the day's work and the coming of the light.

The Mass of the Lord's Supper ends with a procession of the Blessed Sacrament, which is then placed in reposition (on a pecial altar) so that the faithful may remain in vigil. As a result, Catholic churches are unlocked on this evening, providing Catholics with an opportunity to visit several churches. The goal is to spend a few minutes in each church, praying before the Blessed Sacrament & keeping vigil on the night that Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane before his arrest. This is a great tradition for families to engage in; a wonderfully catechetical experience of encountering Mystery. As we enter into the 3 days we know as the Triduum; beginning with Holy Thursday; we will once again take part in an ancient ritual of visiting churches. After Mass, we will pray Night Prayer at SJB.We will caravan to 2 local churches to pray in front of their Repository. Our Holy Thursday tradition isn't all pious; part of what makes the evening enjoyable is the company. So, after our mini pilgrimage, we will return to Bosco, break bread together & catch up on each other's lives in the Faith Formation Office. Please bring a snack to share. Coffee & water will be provided. If you've never participated in the custom of visiting churches on Holy Thursday evening, consider starting your own tradition this year. Let us know if you will be able to join us. YES, I will be there on Holy Thursday evening 3/28.

Family Name:

You may notice purple cloths draped over the crucifixes, statues and saint images in our church. This old custom of veiling religious images is a way of focusing on the penitential aspect of this liturgical season. It reminds us in a visual way that our faith in all its glory is made possible only through the work of Christ in his suffering and death on the cross. When we cover these holy and sacred images that we are so accustomed to, we are starkly confronted and reminded in a poignant way of all that Christ has won for us. Then, as in a dramatic unveiling, the holy images are again revealed at the Easter Vigil to mark the end of the penitential season. The joy of the Easter season and the hope of the Resurrection then comes to the forefront.

Divine Mercy Chaplet on Divine Mercy Sunday.

The Legion of Mary

WHAT IS IT? The Legion of Mary is the largest apostolic organization of lay people in the Catholic Church, with well over 3 million active members in almost every country of the world. It has been active in the United States since 1931, has been approved by the last 6 Popes, and was endorsed by the Second Vatican Council. The main purpose of the Legion of Mary is to give glory to God through the sanctification of its members.

WHAT DOES IT DO? Members become instruments of the Holy Spirit through a balanced program of prayer and service. Works include new parishioner visitation, visitation of the sick or aged, religious education, visiting the newly baptized, Pilgrim Virgin Statue visitations and

meeting the other spiritual needs of the parish community. Legionaries are under the guidance of a spiritual director named by the pastor. The Legion is, in essence, an extension of the heart and hands of the pastor. **HOW DOES IT WORK?** Members meet once a week for prayer, planning and discussion in a family setting. Then they do two hours of definite work each week in pairs and under the guidance of their spir-

A new biopic dedicated to the life of MOTHER CABRINI premiered in theatres on 3/8, coinciding with International Women's Day. The film is based on the true story of Francesca Cabrini, an



Italian Immigrant & centers around the beginning of her mission in New York City in the 19th century. Born Francesa Cabrini, Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in 1880 with 7 other women. After meeting with Pope Leo XIII, the religious sisters traveled to NY to help thousands of vulnerable immigrants facing extreme poverty & disease in a city riddled with crime. The film produced by Angel Studio & directed by Alejandro Gómez Monteverde, follows Mother Cabrini as she sets off on her mission to secure housing & healthcare for society's most vulnerable. Mother Cabrini was canonized in 1946 by Pope Pius XII. She was the first American citizen to be named a Saint & was proclaimed patron saint of all immigrants.

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE In the Eucharistic Miracle at Bois-Seigneur-Isaac, the consecrated Host bled and stained the corporal. On May 3, 1413, the Bishop of Cambrai, Peter d'Ailly, authorized the devotion of the holy relic of the miracle along with a solemn procession. The first procession took place in 1414. On January 13th, 1424, Pope Martin V approved the building of the Monastery of Bois-Seigneur-Isaac. Today the monastery is the goal of pilgrimages. The corporal stained with blood is exposed to view in the chapel.

Here are a few questions to think about as you reflect on the Eucharistic Miracles:
Is it hard for you to understand that Jesus is present in the Eucharist? Why do you think Jesus comes to us in this unrecognizable form? Why wouldn't He make it more obvious to us that He is present? What can you do to increase your belief in the Eucharist? How do the Eucharistic miracles encourage you? Why do you think there are not more miracles of the Eucharist? How does the Eucharist impact your life?
