## THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

#### The Legion of Mary WHAT IS IT?

The Legion of Mary is the largest apostolic organization of lay people in the Catholic Church, with well over 3 million active members in almost every country of the world. It has been active in the United States since 1931, has been approved by the last 6 Popes, and was endorsed by the Second



Vatican Council. The main purpose of the Legion of Mary is to give glory to God through the sanctification of its members.

### WHAT DOES IT DO?

Members become instruments of the Holy Spirit through a balanced program of prayer and service. Works include new parishioner visitation, visitation of the sick or aged, religious education, visiting the newly baptized, Pilgrim Virgin Statue visitations and meeting the other spiritual needs of the parish community. Legionaries are under the guidance of a spiritual director named by the pastor. The Legion is, in essence, an extension of the heart and hands of the pastor.

#### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**

Members meet weekly on Mondays at 6:15pm for prayer, planning and discussion in a family setting. Then they do two hours of definite work each week in pairs and under the guidance of their spiritual director.



In the Bosco Book Club (A Novel Bunch), we'll be reading & discussing newly released, highly rated books from a wide variety of genres.



During the **PARISH YEAR OF THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL**, each week we will reflect on a different Eucharistic Meditation. These quotes are designed to help you spend time in prayer with Jesus during Eucharistic adoration. Even if you can't be present at Adoration, unite yourself spiritually to the Eucharistic as you spend this time in silent prayer: "*The Eucharist is the consummation of the whole spiritual life*."  $\sim$  St. Thomas Aquinas

**EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE** In 1342 a violent thunderstorm suddenly broke out in the village of Stiphout. A lightning bolt struck the parish, setting it on fire. The flames quickly spread everywhere and reached the interior of the church. Not knowing what to do, the elderly pastor, Jan Hocaerts, immediately ran to warn the neighbors. A group of the faithful, led by Jan Baloys, decided to try to rescue the Blessed Sacrament. It was impossible to enter the church and the only solution left was for someone to be lowered down through the window. Jan Baloys volunteered. After breaking the glass of the large window near the altar with a bar, he let himself down inside. With great amazement, he saw that the flames which had already destroyed the whole church were being kept away from the area around the tabernacle. Jan then opened the tabernacle, grabbed the ciborium containing the consecrated Hosts, and carried them to safety. Everyone immediately shouted miracle. The church was later rebuilt and the Hosts remained intact until 1557. Because of historical vicissitudes and religious wars every trace of them was subsequently lost.

Here are a few questions to think about as you reflect on the Eucharistic Miracles: Is it hard for you to understand that Jesus is present in the Eucharist? Why do you think Jesus comes to us in this unrecognizable form? Why wouldn't He make it more obvious to us that He is present? What can you do to increase your belief in the Eucharist? How do the Eucharistic miracles encourage you? Why do you think there are not more miracles of the Eucharist? How does the Eucharist impact your life? The Bishops of the US are calling for a 3year grassroots revival of devotion & belief in the REAL PRESENCE OF JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the US healed, converted, formed & unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world."
