
THE GOOD SHEPHERD LAYS DOWN HIS LIFE FOR HIS SHEEP.

This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep.





THE GOOD SHEPHERD IN THE BIBLE

In the Bible, God has used various images to communicate the kind of relationship He wants with us. One of these powerful images is that of the shepherd. We reflect over this image every fourth Sunday of Easter, which we call "Good Shepherd Sunday."

God is first called a shepherd in Genesis: "the mighty One of Jacob (by the name of the Shepherd, the Rock of Israel)" (Gen 49:24). David was a shepherd, and the Lord chose him to shepherd his people (1 Chr 17:6). Ultimately David and other leaders were only instruments, though. God Himself is our ultimate shepherd, as the Psalms express: "The LORD is my shepherd" (Ps 23:1); "O save your people, and bless your heritage; be their shepherd, and carry them forever" (Ps 28:9); "Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, who lead Joseph like a flock!" (Ps 80:1). Other wisdom books of the Old Testament also refer to the Lord as Israel's shepherd (cf. Eccl 12:11; Sir 18:13). The prophets also proclaim the Lord as Shepherd: "He will feed his flock like a shepherd, he will gather the lambs in his arms, he will carry them in his bosom, and gently lead those that are with young" (Is 40:11); "He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd keeps his flock" (Jer 31:10); "Shepherd your people with your staff, the flock of your inheritance" (Mic 7:14). Since all earthly shepherds are inadequate, the Lord promises Ezekiel that one day He Himself will come to shepherd His people, in order to feed and heal his sheep rightly (Ezk 34). The Lord similarly says through the prophet Zechariah, "So I became the shepherd of the flock doomed to be slain for those who trafficked in the sheep" (Zech 11:7).

All this serves as poignant background for the New Testament. Jesus portrays Himself as the Good Shepherd. He is the Lord Himself who has come to shepherd his people, prophesied by Ezekiel (Ezk 34). He has compassion on the crowds, "because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd" (Mt 9:36; Mk 6:34). In John 10, we have extensive thoughts from the mouth of Christ about His role as our shepherd: "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (Jn 10:11). He knows and calls each of His sheep by name (Jn 10:3). He has come that we might have life, and have it abundantly (Jn 10:10). He has come to gather His sheep in all times and places, so that there will be "one flock, one shepherd" (Jn 10:16). In one of his parables, Jesus speaks about seeking out the lost sheep (Lk 15:3-7). And at Judgment Day, Jesus as King and Good Shepherd will separate the sheep from the goats (Mt 25:32).

Later on in the New Testament, we have four verses referring to Jesus as our Good Shepherd:

- "Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in you that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen" (Heb 13:20-21).
- "For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Guardian of your souls" (1 Pet 2:25).
- "When the chief Shepherd is manifested you will obtain the unfading crown of glory" (1 Pet 5:4).
- "For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water; and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes" (Rev 7:17).

These verses are all fruitful for our meditation on who and what the Lord is for us.

Defiant Requiem is a feature-length documentary film that tells the extraordinary, untold story of the brave acts of resistance by Jewish prisoners at Theresienstadt (Terezin) during World War II.

The film highlights a dramatic example of intellectual and artistic courage: the remarkable story of Rafael Schächter, a brilliant young Czech conductor who demonstrated moral leadership under brutal circumstances by sustaining hope and courage for his fellow prisoners by creating a prisoner choir and “singing to the Nazis what they dared not say.”

This is a film about how a rare form of courage sparked compelling determination to survive by answering the worst of mankind with the best of mankind.

Defiant Requiem was nominated for two Documentary Emmy Awards in 2014 for best writing and best feature length documentary. The film is the recipient of numerous awards and has been broadcast on PBS, BBC4, French TV and Globostat in Brazil.
