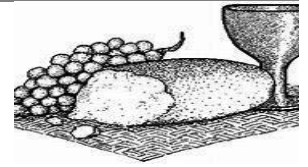

#### OCTOBER DEVOTIONS TO MARY

My dearest friends, the safest thing to do is to pray always. Prayer is our link God. The months of May and October presents us with special devotions to Mary our Mother. There is a possible connection between the Rosary, Mary, and the months of May and of October. In the northern hemisphere, May is a month of new life; of spring. October, conversely, is when the green leaves of spring and summer slowly die, but

in their dying they become more beautifully colorful than ever. Of course, the opposite is true in the southern hemisphere, where in October the earth brings forth new life. Nevertheless, these two months are excellent times to remember the life of Jesus through the Rosary, and the role of his mother, Mary as first disciple in this plan of God, from Jesus' conception via the Holy Spirit in her womb, to the agony and yet triumph of the cross, to the glory of Christ's resurrection and ascension, and to the birth of the Church at Pentecost.

The First Council of Ephesus in 431 first defined Mary dogmatically as Theotokos, or God-bearer, in Greek. More recently, Vatican II's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church, Lumen Gentium (1964), devoted its entire final chapter to a reflection on Mary. These among other documents, as I see them, affirm at the highest level of Church teaching Mary's importance for our faith. Mary is not so much exalted in her own right, but because she points us in two directions: Through her are revealed truths first about her Son, Jesus, fully both human and divine and, second, about us. In October, in a special way, we remember Mary both as Mother of God and as our mother. This month includes the feasts of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7), as well as those of Blessed John Paul II (October 22), and of a Canadian, Blessed Marie-Rose Durocher (October 6), both great devotees of Mary. October also begins with the memorial of St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus. The French Carmelite once wrote that she was drawn especially to Mary, not so much because she is Queen of heaven, but because she is our mother. Let us, with St. Thérèse among all God's saints, this October and forever, rejoice that we are children of so great a mother.

I invite you, dearest friends in Christ, to this special month of prayers. Come as families, individuals, friends, Associations, societies and sodalities. It is time to build more graces and to intercede for our drowning world.

The blood bank is at a critical blood shortage due to the recent events. If you would consider donating it would be greatly appreciated. The blood center is taking extra precautions to help prevent the risk of spreading infectious agents. The set-up will be changed to allow for more social distancing between donors and staff. The employees of the drive will have their temperature taken before the start of the drive. The employees are required to wear masks and gloves. The employees will clean regularly all public surfaces. We ask that all potential donors to wear their masks at all times. The donors temperature will be taken before the registration process. The donor should make an appointment in advance by either calling the rectory or them at 800-933-2566 or on-line with them at [www.nybc.org](http://www.nybc.org). We will be able to accommodate some walk-ins as space allows. All refreshments that are provided to donors are single served and individually wrapped.

Your blood could help someone who is in for surgery, someone who needs a blood transfusion, a child or adult being treated for cancer or a person who has lost blood in an accident. Please prayerfully consider if you can help.

## **THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS**

### **Reading I: Ezekiel 18: 25-28**

In a question and answer format, the author deals both with people who repent of their evil, and those who turn to it. He provides his responses to both.

### **Reading II: Philippians 2: 1-11, or 2: 1-5**

The scholars tell us this beautiful

passage Paul quotes is actually from an early Church hymn. The first part sings of the Lord's abasement; the second of His earned exaltation.

### **The Gospel: Matthew 21: 28-32**

This parable continues earlier stories in Matthew about the people who actually are part of God's kingdom. Jesus tells the religious leaders in his audience that "tax collectors and prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you." The folks who look the least religious will enter God's kingdom ahead of religious leaders, because in the end they do God's will.

## **STRAYING FROM OUR INTENDED DESTINATION**

I remember the contrast so well, and how it made my brother come out on top. Mom would leave the kitchen where she was preparing our dinner, while we kids were gathered around the TV, rapt in attention to the likes of "Ramar, King of the Jungle" aimed at our age group. Mom would come into the living room and announce to me, "I need you to empty the garbage." Well, I'm ashamed to admit that I grumbled a little, but I grudgingly got up and did it. Obedience was vigorously endorsed in our family.

Now sometimes Mom would ask something similar of my younger brother at the usually unwelcome time. He was just as obedient, but he would simply say "OK, Mom" minus grumble. So, Mom would calmly return to her kitchen and my brother didn't miss a moment of Ramar's adventures. However, he would delay doing the job or even forget it. Surely that brought consequences. That little vignette comes to my mind as I reflect on this weekend's Gospel, even though there's no exact parallel.

Of course, the Gospel is not about childhood chores done or undone. But it is about the fact that our all-important eternal future depends on how we react to God's requests of us. How do we respond to Him? Do we renege on our commitment to Him when He makes demands of us? When He disturbs our spiritual equilibrium?

We know from experience that often what He asks of us comes with bad timing, or so we think. That's precisely when it is helpful to look for good example from good people. It is comforting for us sinners to note that difficult "chores" are asked even of the holiest people. God doesn't spare them the test.

Our Blessed Mother faced a momentous decision when the angel Gabriel came calling with the Lord's request. Not knowing anything more than the fact that her life was about to change completely, she gave her immediate "Fiat", "Let it be done to me." What strength, what faith, what trust in a young girl's beautiful soul! That's what God loved in her then and always will.

Nor was God's request one that made life easy for our noble St. Joseph. Think about his shock at Mary's news when she told him. Then ponder what he did in trusting obedience to God. In general, things haven't been much different for all the other saints, those known and unknown, who grace the history of our Church.

Our Lord asks us every day to change our mindset about how and when we are going to do His will. I daresay it is rarely if ever based on our convenience. So, we need that readiness exemplified by the holy ones. That way we can hope to join them in heaven.

In St. Louis there is a railroad switchyard. One particular switch begins with just the thinnest piece of steel to direct a train away from one main track to another. If you were to follow these two tracks, however, you would find that one ends in San Francisco, the other in New York. Sin is like that. Just a small deviation from God's standards can place us far afield from our intended destination. No need to get lost, is there?

### **DEVOCIONES DE OCTUBRE A MARÍA**

Por supuesto, lo contrario es cierto en el hemisferio sur, donde en octubre la tierra trae nueva vida. Sin embargo, estos dos meses son momentos excelentes para recordar la vida de Jesús a través del Rosario, y el papel de su madre, María, como primera discípula en este plan de Dios, desde la concepción de Jesús vía el Espíritu Santo en su seno, hasta la agonía. y, sin embargo, el triunfo de la cruz, para la gloria de la resurrección y ascensión de Cristo, y el nacimiento de la Iglesia en Pentecostés.

El Primer Concilio de Éfeso en 431 definió por primera vez a María dogmáticamente como Theotokos, o portadora de Dios, en griego. Más recientemente, la Constitución Dogmática sobre la Iglesia del Vaticano II, Lumen Gentium (1964), dedicó todo su capítulo final a una reflexión sobre María. Estos, entre otros documentos, a mi modo de ver, afirman al más alto nivel de enseñanza de la Iglesia la importancia de María para nuestra fe. María no se exalta tanto por derecho propio, sino porque nos señala en dos direcciones: a través de ella se revelan primero las verdades sobre su Hijo, Jesús, plenamente humano y divino y, segundo, sobre nosotros.

En Octubre, de manera especial, recordamos a María como Madre de Dios y como nuestra Madre. Este mes incluye las fiestas de Nuestra Señora del Rosario (7 de octubre), así como las del Beato Juan Pablo II (22 de octubre), y de una canadiense, la Beata Marie-Rose Durocher (6 de octubre), ambas grandes devotas de María. . Octubre también comienza con la memoria de Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús. La carmelita francesa escribió una vez que se sintió atraída especialmente por María, no tanto porque sea la Reina del cielo, sino porque es nuestra

madre. Regocijémonos, con Santa Teresa entre todos los santos de Dios, este octubre y para siempre, de ser hijos de una madre tan grande.

Los invito, queridos amigos en Cristo, a este mes especial de oraciones. Vengan como familias, individuos, amigos, Asociaciones, sociedades y cofradías. Es hora de construir más gracias e interceder por nuestro mundo ahogado.

### **SALIENDO DE NUESTRO DESTINO**

#### **PREVISTO**

Recuerdo muy bien el contraste y cómo hizo que mi hermano saliera victorioso. Mamá salía de la cocina donde estaba preparando nuestra cena, mientras los niños estábamos reunidos alrededor del televisor, absortos en atención a los gustos de "Ramar, rey de la selva" dirigido a nuestro grupo de edad. Mamá entraba a la sala de estar y me anunciaba: "Necesito que vacíes la basura". Bueno, me da vergüenza admitir que gruñí un poco, pero me levanté de mala gana y lo hice, la obediencia fue respaldada vigorosamente en nuestra familia.

Ahora, a veces mamá le preguntaba algo similar a mi hermano menor en el momento generalmente desagradable. Él era igual de obediente, pero simplemente decía "Está bien, mamá" sin quejas. Entonces, mamá regresaba tranquilamente a su cocina y mi hermano no se perdía ni un momento de las aventuras de Ramar. Sin embargo, retrasaría la realización del trabajo o incluso lo olvidaría. Seguramente eso trajo consecuencias. Esa pequeña viñeta me viene a la mente mientras reflexiono sobre el Evangelio de este fin de semana, aunque no hay un paralelo exacto.

Por supuesto, el Evangelio no se trata de quehaceres de la niñez hechos o deshechos. Pero se trata del hecho de que nuestro importantísimo futuro eterno depende de cómo reaccionamos a las peticiones que Dios nos hace. ¿Cómo le respondemos? ¿Renegamos de nuestro compromiso con Él cuando Él nos exige? ¿Cuándo perturba nuestro equilibrio espiritual? Sabemos por experiencia que a menudo lo que nos pide llega en un mal momento, o eso creemos. Ahí es

precisamente cuando resulta útil buscar un buen ejemplo en personas buenas. Es reconfortante para nosotros los pecadores notar que se piden "tareas" difíciles incluso a las personas más santas. Dios no les ahorra la prueba.

Nuestra Santísima Madre enfrentó una decisión trascendental cuando el ángel Gabriel vino a llamar con la petición del Señor. Sin saber nada más que el hecho de que su vida estaba a punto de cambiar por completo, dio su "Fiat" inmediato, "Que se me haga". ¡Qué fuerza, qué fe, qué confianza en el alma hermosa de una joven! Eso es lo que Dios amó en ella entonces y siempre lo hará.

Tampoco fue el pedido de Dios uno que le facilitó la vida a nuestro noble San José. Piense en su sorpresa por la noticia de Mary cuando se lo contó. Luego reflexiona sobre lo que hizo al confiar en la obediencia a Dios. En general, las cosas no han sido muy diferentes para todos los demás santos, conocidos y desconocidos, que adornan la historia de nuestra Iglesia.

Nuestro Señor nos pide todos los días que cambiemos nuestra forma de pensar sobre cómo y cuándo vamos a hacer Su voluntad. Me atrevería a decir que rara vez se basa en nuestra conveniencia. Por lo tanto, necesitamos esa disposición ejemplificada por los santos. De esa manera podemos esperar unirnos a ellos en el cielo.

En St. Louis hay un patio de maniobras de ferrocarril. Un interruptor en particular comienza con la pieza más delgada de acero para desviar un tren de una vía principal a otra. Sin embargo, si siguieras estas dos pistas, descubrirías que una termina en San Francisco y la otra en Nueva York. El pecado es así. Una pequeña desviación de las normas de Dios puede colocarnos muy lejos de nuestro destino previsto. No hay necesidad de perderse, ¿verdad?
