



Message from Father Octavio.

Last week we heard the Gospel of the Good Shepherd, where Jesus declares himself the Good Shepherd, "I am the Good Shepherd, the good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." (Jn 10, 11). This Fifth Sunday of Easter, we hear another statement from Jesus, who calls himself the True Vine, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. He plucks up the branch that bears no fruit in me, and the one that bears fruit." prunes it so that it bears more fruit." (Jn 15, 1).

The first thing we must know to understand this passage of Scripture is that it is a vine and a branch. The dictionary of the Royal Spanish Academy defines the word vine as: "A perennial and climbing plant of the Vitaceae family, with a twisted trunk, very long, flexible and gnarled stems, whose fruit is the grape." And the word shoot is defined as: "Scion of the vine, long, thin, flexible and knotty, from which the leaves, earwigs and clusters sprout." In these two definitions, we can see that the Vine is the trunk, where the sap that feeds all the branches of the plant passes. For this reason, the branches, which are the new shoots or shoots that emerge from the vine, receive from it all the strength and food to develop and thus be able to bear good fruit.

The image of the Vine, and its symbolism are very deep. In the Old Testament the people of Israel appear as the Vineyard of the Lord. Psalm 80 and Isaiah 5 speak of the vine that the Lord planted. Furthermore, the Lord planted a good stock (good seed), and surrounded it with care, but in the end the fruits that the People of Israel produced were bitter.

The new Vine is Our Lord Jesus Christ, and we (The Church) are its branches. Christ is the new tree of Life. Everyone who is united with Christ can produce sweet and good fruits. Since He is the True Vine and there is no other through whom we can receive grace after grace, as the prologue of Saint John says.

Christ will say later in the gospel, "remain in me, as I remain in you." Therefore, if we distance ourselves from Christ, our soul and our heart will dry up little by little, until they are thrown into the bonfire, which symbolizes hell. We experience hell, to the extent that we distance ourselves from Christ. If we are united to Him, we experience Heaven, and we produce many fruits, and the fruit that the Lord wants to produce in us is the fruit of Love. Saint Paul tells us in the Letter to the Romans, "The Love of God has been poured out in our hearts with the Holy Spirit that has been given to us..." Christ is the Love of God made flesh for us, who gives us the grace to love, forgive, serve, to give our lives for our brothers, etc. Without Christ and without the Holy Spirit, who has been sent by Christ to us, we would be incapable of loving, the most selfish and perverse beings, we would live only thinking about ourselves and no one else.

It is true that we are like those tender shoots that the wind and storms can destroy us, but if we are grafted into Christ, we do not have to fear. Without Christ we can do nothing, but with Christ everything is possible, as Saint Paul says, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4, 13)



Mensagem do Padre Octavio.

Na semana passada ouvimos o Evangelho do Bom Pastor, onde Jesus se declara o Bom Pastor: "Eu sou o Bom Pastor, o bom pastor dá a sua vida pelas ovelhas". (João 10, 11). Neste quinto domingo de Páscoa, ouvimos outra afirmação de Jesus, que se autodenomina Videira Verdadeira: "Eu sou a videira verdadeira e meu Pai é o viticultor. fruto." poda-o para que dê mais fruto." (João 15, 1).

A primeira coisa que precisamos saber para entender esta passagem das Escrituras é que ela é uma videira e um ramo. O dicionário da Real Academia Espanhola define a palavra videira como: "Planta perene e trepadeira da família Vitácea, de tronco retorcido, caule muito longo, flexível e nodoso, cujo fruto é a uva". E a palavra broto é definida como: "Descendente da videira, longo, fino, flexível e nodoso, de onde brotam as folhas, tesourinhas e cachos". Nessas duas definições podemos perceber que a Videira é o tronco, por onde passa a seiva que alimenta todos os ramos da planta. Por isso, os ramos, que são os novos rebentos ou rebentos que emergem da videira, recebem dela toda a força e alimento para se desenvolverem e assim poderem dar bons frutos.

A imagem da Videira e o seu simbolismo são muito profundos. No Antigo Testamento o povo de Israel aparece como a Vinha do Senhor. O Salmo 80 e Isaías 5 falam da videira que o Senhor plantou. Além disso, o Senhor plantou um bom estoque (boa semente), e cercou-o de cuidado, mas no final os frutos que o Povo de Israel produziu foram amargos.

A nova Videira é Nosso Senhor Jesus Cristo, e nós (A Igreja) somos os seus ramos. Cristo é a nova árvore da Vida. Todo aquele que está unido a Cristo pode produzir frutos bons e doces. Pois Ele é a Videira Verdadeira e não há outra por quem possamos receber graça após graça, como diz o prólogo de São João. Cristo dirá mais tarde no evangelho: "permaneça em mim, assim como eu permaneço em você". Portanto, se nos distanciarmos de Cristo, nossa alma e nosso coração vão secando aos poucos, até serem jogados na fogueira, que simboliza o inferno. Vivemos o inferno, na medida em que nos distanciarmos de Cristo. Se estivermos unidos a Ele, experimentamos o Céu e produzimos muitos frutos, e o fruto que o Senhor quer produzir em nós é o fruto do Amor, diz-nos São Paulo na Carta aos Romanos: "O Amor de Deus. foi derramado em nossos corações com o Espírito Santo que nos foi dado..." Cristo é o Amor de Deus que se fez carne por nós, que nos dá a graça de amar, perdoar, servir, dar a vida pelos irmãos, etc. Sem Cristo e sem o Espírito Santo, que nos foi enviado por Cristo, seríamos incapazes de amar, os seres mais egoístas e perversos, viveríamos pensando apenas em nós mesmos e em mais ninguém.

É verdade que somos como aqueles tenros rebentos, que o vento e tempestades podem destruir-nos, mas se estivermos enxertados em Cristo, não devemos temer. Sem Cristo nada podemos fazer, com Cristo tudo é possível, como diz São Paulo: "Posso todas as coisas em Cristo que me fortalece". (Filipenses 4, 13)

SPANISH BULLETIN BOARD

Mensaje del padre Octavio.

La semana pasada escuchamos el Evangelio del Buen Pastor, donde Jesús se declara el Buen Pastor, "Yo soy el Buen Pastor, el buen pastor da su vida por las ovejas." (Jn 10, 11). Este quinto domingo de Pascua, escuchamos otra afirmación de Jesús, quien se nombra la Vid Verdadera, "Yo soy la verdadera vid y mi Padre es el viñador. Al sarmiento que no da fruto en mí, él lo arranca, y al que da fruto lo poda para que dé más fruto." (Jn 15, 1).

Lo primero que tenemos que saber para entender este pasaje de la Escritura es, que es una vid y un sarmiento. El diccionario de la Real Academia Española define la palabra vid como: "Planta vivaz y trepadora de la familia de las vitáceas, con tronco retorcido, vástagos muy largos, flexibles y nudosos, cuyo fruto es la uva." Y la palabra sarmiento la define como: "Vástago de la vid, largo, delgado, flexible y nudoso, de donde brotan las hojas, las tijeretas y los racimos." En estas dos definiciones, podemos ver que la Vid es el tronco, donde pasa la sabia que alimenta a todas las ramas de la planta. Por esta razón, los sarmientos que son los brotes o retoños nuevos que surgen de la vid, reciben de ella toda la fuerza, y el alimento para desarrollarse y así poder dar buenos frutos.

La imagen de la Vid, y su simbolismo son muy profundos. En el Antiguo Testamento aparece el pueblo de Israel como la Viña del Señor. El Salmo 80 e Isaías 5, hablan de la vid que plantó el Señor. Además, el Señor plantó, buena cepa (buena semilla), y la rodeó de cuidados, pero al final los frutos que produjo el Pueblo de Israel fueron amargos.

La nueva Vid es Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, y nosotros (La Iglesia), somos sus sarmientos. Cristo es el nuevo árbol de la Vida. Todo aquel que esta unido a Cristo puede producir frutos dulces y buenos. Ya que Él es la Vid Verdadera y no hay otro por el que podamos recibir gracia tras gracia, como dice el prologo de San Juan.

Cristo dirá más adelante en el evangelio, "permanezcan en mí, como yo permanezco en ustedes." Por lo tanto, si nos alejamos de Cristo, nuestra alma y nuestro corazón se irán secando poco a poco, hasta ser tirados en la hoguera, la cual simboliza el infierno. Experimentamos el infierno, en la medida que nos alejamos de Cristo. Si estamos unidos a Él, experimentamos el Cielo, y producimos muchos frutos, y el fruto que quiere producir el Señor en nosotros en el fruto del Amor. Nos dice San Pablo en la Carta a los Romanos, "El Amor de Dios ha sido derramado en nuestros corazones con el Espíritu Santo que se nos ha dado..." Cristo es el Amor de Dios hecho carne para nosotros, que nos da la gracia de amar, perdonar, servir, de dar la vida por los hermanos, etc. Sin Cristo y sin el Espíritu Santo, quien ha sido enviado por Cristo a nosotros, seríamos incapaces de amar, los seres más egoístas y perversos, viviríamos solamente pensando en nosotros y en nadie más.

Es cierto que nosotros somos como esos brotes tiernos, que el viento y las tempestades pueden destruirnos, pero si estamos injertados en Cristo, no tenemos que temer. Sin Cristo no podemos hacer nada, pero con Cristo todo se puede, como dice San Pablo, "Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me fortalece". (Filipenses 4, 13)

CHINESE APOSTLE

复活期第五主日 (4/28/2024)

今天是复活期第五主日。在今天的福音中耶稣说：【我是真葡萄树，我父是园丁。凡在我身上不结果实的枝子，祂就剪掉；结果实的，祂就修剪清理，使它结出更多的果实。】【我是葡萄树，你们是葡萄枝。那住在我内，我也住在他内的，必结出更多的果实。】

在依撒意亚先知书中，先知已为我们预言了主基督对我们的教导，他与我们的关系，就是葡萄树和葡萄枝的关系，我们基督徒要跟随他，结出属于天国的生命果实，并做主耶稣的门徒，邀请更多的人通过认识主，悔改而归向上主。

为结果实，葡萄树枝必须与树干相连，才能吸取水份和养分，以维持生命和结果。如国树枝和树干分离，树枝不仅长不出果实，其本身也会干枯死亡。同样，我们基督徒如果离开天主，我们就会因为没有主赋予给我们的生命和拒绝主的恩宠而滑向深渊，我们属灵的生命会被世间的污泥浊水侵吞而死亡，主的救赎工作也就很难在我们身上彰显。

主耶稣基督的圣言，圣体和圣血就是葡萄树。我们基督徒要常聆听主的圣言，领基督的圣体和圣血，并与其他人以我们的善行分享主的爱，引领那些不认识主的人到主的面前。这就是我们这些基督徒葡萄枝应结的果实。

下面主日读经及福音（宗9：26-31；若一3：18-24；若15：1-8）的反省 摘自【我灵赞颂主 iBreviarium】

耶穌以葡萄樹與枝條的關係，來闡明我們與祂之間，息息相關的生命聯繫。倘若不留在葡萄樹上，葡萄枝必然會乾枯。但為使葡萄樹結出果實，天父的修剪是必須的，這就是教會常說的靈性的淨化。修剪是痛苦的過程，因為將有看似屬於我們的枝條被去掉，這正是基督逾越奧跡的體現，愛的果實，只能從自我捨棄的修剪中生長。這裡耶穌特別提到，不結果實的要被剪掉，修剪和剪掉的過程看似相同，但其目的卻非常不一樣，在每人身上發生的一切，到底是修剪還是剪掉，這是屬於天父的秘密。無論如何靠，我們無法靠自己結出果實，必須要住在祂內。
