A Message from Msgr. Joe

As we gather today in Christ's name, we can reflect on the fact that ours is but one of many, many communities throughout the world that are gathering today in the same way. Indeed, Christ is the true vine and there are many branches. As we continue today, perhaps our prayer can be that each of the branches grow stronger on the vine, and that all might grow closer together as we share Christ's mission on this earth to proclaim the Good News and witness of the resurrection. "The Nightingale and the Rose" by Oscar Wilde is based on the need for a student to get a red rose in the middle of winter for his beloved. It narrates how the only way for the nightingale to get the red rose is to nourish the rosebush with her own blood. The gospel this weekend presents the image of the vine in a quite similar artistic style. As a logical statement, the vine should yield grapes. However, speaking of Israel as a vine, the prophet Isaiah sung, "I sing for my friend, my confrere's song for his vineyard. My friend he had a vineyard high up on a fertile slope. He dug it, cleared it of stones and planted it with merlot; he built a tower inside it, hewed out a wine vat within. He waited for grapes to come, they came sour." Through this poetic parable, the accusation was clear: God has constantly loved his people, and the people have not produced fruit. There was a "season of winter" during the Second Temple Judaism period. There was an expectancy of spring, and a hope for a change. And in the midst of these sterile times, our Lord comes proclaiming: "I am the true vine; my Father is the vine grower... [And] you

are the branches." This was a climate alteration. The level of nurturing the vine has gone beyond the effort of gardener. The caring has gone deeper: the vine was now nurtured by blood. How can we deprive our planter of delicious wine? He is like that little nightingale who fed the plant with her own blood. The realization of having been spiritually grafted in Jesus Christ gives a new perspective of our own existence. It reminds us of our dependency on the Lord, it encourages us to give abundant fruit, and it makes us willing to be pruned by God. "Be happy, cried the Nightingale, be happy; you shall have your red rose. I will build it out of music by moonlight, and stain it with my own heart's blood. All that I ask of you in return is that you will be a true lover, for Love is wiser than Philosophy." (Oscar Wilde, The Nightingale and the Rose).

I invite you this week to remember in a particular way the children of our parish who will be receiving their First Holy Communion this coming Saturday. While it is a very important day in their lives and that of their parents and families, it is also an important day for our whole community. Not only to we welcome them to the table of the Lord, giving thanks for their parents and catechists who have partnered with their parents in teaching and sharing of our belief in the sacramental presence of the Lord in the Eucharist, but it serves to remind all of us of this great gift of the very presence of the Lord, nourishing our baptismal grace and our life in Christ. As they approach the Lord with reverence and awe, may their example inspire reverence and awe in each of us who have been blessed to approach this same Lord so often through the years.

As we continue the journey through Easter may we strive to keep the joy of this great festival alive particularly as we welcome the children of our parish family to fuller participation in the Eucharist. It is in Eucharist, when we are at our best as Church and being Church. God Bless and have a good week.



out care, the shrubs become unkempt, the grass looks like hay, the flowers become leggy. Cutting back, cutting down, cutting away is what brings out the beauty of a landscape. This kind of work is more than a matter of simple tidiness. It shows that the people who live on the property care. In the gospel, Jesus metaphorically speaks of his Father's pruning us branches who are attached to the vine who is Jesus. God's care for us underlies the oft-repeated gospel words remain, fruit, vine, branch. Just as God planted and tended the true vine Jesus, so does God tend usprune us-so that we, too, might "bear much fruit." God prunes from us whatever does not give life, and nourishes within us whatever does. Our remaining in Jesus, our bearing fruit as disciples, our believing in the Son and keeping the commandments (see second reading) are all the work of the Father who tends with great care the risen Life we share with Jesus. The pruning of which Jesus speaks in this gospel is simply a means to an end. The end is the bearing of much fruit. To this end, Jesus' word has a twofold purpose. On the one hand, his word is prophetic and prunes whatever drains life out of his disciples. On the other, his word is the very sap of life that enables disciples to remain in him and bear fruit. True discipleship is to "remain" in Jesus. Only then does his risen Life bloom in us

The good fruit we bear when we remain in Jesus is witnessing to Gospel living, drawing others to the Life Jesus offers in the Holy Spirit, and glorifying the Father by the choices we make to live as Jesus taught us. True discipleship is about bearing this fruit. True discipleship, on the one hand, is very personal and at hand: we must remain in Jesus, grow in our relationship with him, and listen to his words and take them into our heart as a habit of living. On the other hand, true discipleship is very other-centered and

for all to see.

broad: we must reach out to the whole world. The fruit we bear by remaining in Jesus is continuing his ministry of bringing salvation to all people. Oh, how sweet is this fruit! In the first reading the disciples were afraid to relate to Saul because of his past reputation for persecuting Christians. Barnabas, a member of the community, took Paul under his wings and witnessed to the community on his behalf. In this way was Paul accepted so he could preach the word. Barnabas witnessed to how Paul was "pruned" by his encounter with the risen Jesus, an encounter so intense that he was "pruned" from his old zealous hatred of this new Jewish sect ample of how we remain in Jesus and became a disciple himself, one

who "remained" in Jesus. Part of our living the paschal mystery-its dying and rising-requires that we be willing to be pruned. We must allow God to tend us, so that we might rid ourselves of whatever gets in the way of our being a faithful disciple who not only proclaims the Gospel, but also lives it in "deed and truth." First of all, this means that we must witness to an intimate relationship with God. We do this through prayer and worshipboth private and public acts of glorifying God. We also witness in "deed and truth" through how we relate to others. Taking someone troubled under our wing to help them is but one exthrough our caring for others.

Paul the Apostle came to Jerusalem, where the other disciples were afraid of him. Then they learned that the Lord had spoken to Paul and he had preached openly in Damascus. When they learned that someone wanted to kill him, they protected him because they fully believed he had converted.

Second Reading: 1 John 3: 1-2

John clearly states that we must love one another. All people who believe in Jesus Christ can show their faith only through their actions. If people believe in Jesus and love one another as he commanded us, they prove that they are true believers in Christ.

Gospel: John 10: 11-18

Jesus compares himself to a vine, and compares his father to the vine-grower. He explains how God prunes the barren branches so that the rest might yield more fruit. He reminds them that apart from himself, his followers could not bear fruit.






