

A Message from Msgr. Joe

One of the wonderful things about vacations is the time we spend two or three weeks afterward savoring the experience, sharing vacation photos and memories with our family and friends. This kind of reflection puts us back in touch with the original experience and reminds us of the relaxation and wonder the vacation afforded us. Today, on the Third Sunday of Easter, the Church blesses us with reminders of what we celebrated two Sundays ago. All three readings are reflections on the meaning of the death and resurrection of Christ. One of the threads running through these reflections is that the purpose of the Lord's suffering, death, and resurrection was to save us, to forgive our sins. We are given fifty days to ponder this reality--fifty days to savor the experience of Christ's dying and rising for us.

The recounting of the story of the trip to Emmaus that begins our gospel this weekend is one of those wonderful gospel encounters that invites us to become a part of it. The two walkers were not big names in the early Church, so far as we know. It seems they were just regular people like us. Only one of the two is even named in the story, which leaves each of us free to imagine being the other companion on the journey. How sadly that journey must have begun. After the pulse-quickening hosannas of the entry into Jerusalem came the agony of Good Friday and then the imponderable empty tomb of Easter morning. We would not be

surprised if these two found the whole thing just too much to deal with, and felt the need to get away somewhere to recover their wits. It should be reassuring to us that Jesus took time on the very first day of his resurrection to seek out these two ordinary people to comfort them. Notice how they received his individual attention and care. This might be something to hold onto when we feel confused or especially bruised by life. We sometimes might fall into the trap of thinking that church is the place to go only when we feel secure in our faith. Sure, we want to go on days when we can sing out the alleluias with all the gusto they deserve. However, it is also important for us to remember that there is room for us in the pews when we are confused and don't know how to pray. When we cannot get life's puzzle pieces to fit together we especially need a visit with Jesus, and the Mass is one good way to seek him out. So, will one stop at church solve all our problems? Most likely not, though stranger things have happened. What we can reasonably expect, is to have some encounter with love and truth. They might be communicated in a friendly greeting, or perhaps in the readings we might be struck by the way that God watches over the children of Abraham, or how Jesus wept at the grave of his friend Lazarus or how the Holy Spirit gave a simple fisherman the nerve to speak out like a prophet. An encounter like that can remind us that there is some love and truth left in the world, and that can protect us from the real danger when we are confused, which is despair: the belief that all the good is gone. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we might once again feel our hearts burning within us and receive the grace to recognize Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We offer our congratulations to our newly confirmed young people and give thanks to God for their parents, sponsors and catechists who have journeyed with them to this day of being sealed in the gifts of the Holy Spirit. As their parish family we await the fruits of the Spirit they shared with us through their witness to their faith in Jesus. God Bless!



REFLECTING THE GOSPEL

Why think about sins and forgiveness during Easter time? What a bummer! Easter is a joyful time to celebrate new Life! It is thus surprising that repentance and forgiveness (acts we much more readily associate with Lent) figure so prominently in all three readings assigned to this Third Sunday of Easter. The readings suggest to us that we, unlike the disciples to whom Jesus appeared after the resurrection, cannot look at, touch, see with our own eyes this Jesus who was dead and now is risen to new Life. Yet Jesus gives us another, just as concrete, means to come to belief in the new Life of resurrection.

Repentance and forgiveness are themselves encounters with the risen Jesus, an invitation to deeper belief, and an experience of our own coming to a share in Jesus' risen Life. Jesus opened the minds of the disciples to grasp two things written in the Scriptures: that he "would suffer and rise from the dead," and that "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations." Our repentanceconversion of life turns us to the God who forgives and who fills us with the new Life of the resurrection. Ultimately, this risen Life within us empowers a way of living that witnesses to God's forgiveness of our sinfulness. Our belief in the resurrection cannot

be passive. Our belief in the risen Jesus is made visible when we "preach in his name" the kind of repentance leading to the new life of forgiveness. We encounter Jesus today when we repent of our sins and forgive others. Jesus "was made known" in the breaking of the bread and in repentance and forgiveness. Why is forgiveness so central to embracing Jesus' risen Life? Being forgiven by God for our offenses means that the weakened or destroyed relationship caused by sin is strengthened or restored. We become

strong once again in the Life that God offers us. Forgiving others who have hurt us means that we are not controlled by their hurtful actions, a control that can lead to resentment, anger, hate. Forgiving another might not erase the hurt, but it does free us to live with compassion and joy. These are virtues of risen Life. This is risen Life: "You are forgiven." This is our witness to the resurrection: "I forgive you."

The resurrection claims us as witnesses not only to God's forgiveness of us, but also to our forgiveness of one another. Repentance-conversion of life opens new opportunities to touch and see the risen Jesus. Repentance opens us to God's gift of forgiveness. Repentance opens us to the new Life of resurrection Jesus offers. Ultimate-

ly, the resurrection is a pledge of new Life for us and makes visible God's forgiveness of our sinfulness. Forgiveness is part of the reality of risen Life; it is the effect of death and resurrection. Repentance and forgiveness do not belong simply to Lent-there, that's over for another year. Instead, they are very much a part of the Easter mystery. Forgiveness is the virtue that enables us not to allow past hurts to determine our decisions and actions in the here and now. Forgiveness opens up the space for creating together with the one forgiven a new future where we can "fall peacefully asleep" (responsorial psalm). Giving and receiving forgiveness is a resurrection activity. Walking and acting like a forgiven and forgiving people is how we make known the risen Jesus.

EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 3: 13-15, 17-19	Peter's sermon theme is that the suffering Messiah was raised from the dead. This implies our personal need for repentance and conversion.
Second Reading: I John 2: 1-5a	The author connects knowledge of Christ with observance of His commands. This in turn leads to a deep love of God.
Gospel: Luke 24: 35-38	The main point is not the reality of Jesus' body as much as it is His victory over death by His renewal of the table fellowship with His disciples. Preaching repentance "to all nations" becomes their mission.
