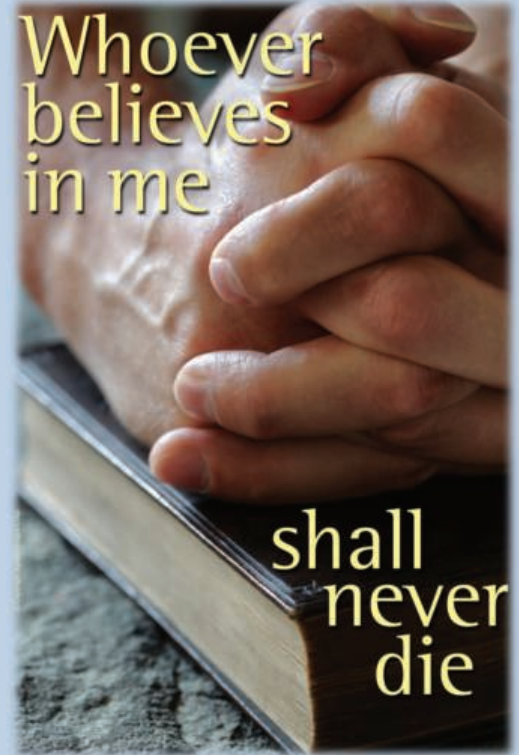
From the Pastor's Desk...

We are currently seeking parishioners who want to apply to be part of the Pastoral Council of our parish. The Pastoral Council is an advisory body to the pastor, which assists the pastor in discerning important matters in the life of the parish. You'll find an application on the parish website in the coming days. I encourage you to apply, if the Holy Spirit prompts you to do so!

The schedule for Holy Week and Easter will be available soon. Although it's hard to believe, Easter will be here before we know it! As we come to these last days of Lent, you'll notice upon coming into the Church that the images of the Lord and the saints are covered with purple cloth. It can be an unsettling sight: an unmistakable visual reminder that we are coming to the end of Lent, when we will be confronted with the Passion of the Lord. We can see something of a Scriptural basis for this from the Gospel of John: "But Jesus hid himself and went out of the temple" (John 8:59). Just as Christ hid himself from the crowds and went away, the statues and images have now been hidden from our sight. As the year continues to move toward Easter, we persevere in our Lenten works in a more intentional way — and we continue to fast, even fasting from being able to see the beautiful statues and images that we find in our church.

The starkness of a church in which all the images are hidden helps to build up within us a longing for Easter, when the fabric will be removed and we will be able to see the images again as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus. We can also see in it a reminder that we have been made in the image and likeness of God in a wonderful way — but sometimes we conceal that image when we don't live up to our calling to live as kind witnesses of the love of God. The end of Lent is a great time to shake off anything that might be preventing us from being witnesses to the fact that all of us have been made in his image, and each of us has been given the high dignity that corresponds to such a likeness.
