
Prayer For Our Parish

Reconciliation

This sacrament is held on Saturdays at 3pm (St. Augustine's Church). Daily (Monday - Friday) 8:30am to 9am at (St. Elizabeth's Church).

Anointing of the Sick

This is a sacrament of healing. Do not hesitate to call the office if you or a member of your family wishes to receive this sacrament in your home, at the hospital or nursing home.

Care of the Sick or Homebound

Please notify the Parish Office when you or a member of your family is unable to attend Mass and would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick or Holy Eucharist.

Hospital Visitation

If you are a patient in the hospital and wish to be visited and/or receive Communion or the Anointing of the Sick, you must inform the hospital of your wishes. You or a family member must request a chaplain visit or we cannot visit you.

Marriage

Please make arrangements at least one year in advance by calling the Parish Office.

Marriage Preparation
In the Diocese of Fall River, Marriage Preparation includes 1) an initial meeting with the priest who is preparing you for Marriage (fill out pre-marital investigation forms), 2) Obtain new copies of Sacramental Certificates, 3) get letter of delegation from your home parish 4) have priest obtain any dispensations needed from that Diocese 5) the FOCCUS profile, 6) Register for Pre-Cana, 7) the FOCCUS evaluation, 8) Attend Pre-Cana (Certificate of Completion, 9) Plan Wedding Liturgy (Together For Life), 10) Last visit with priest, 11) Rehearsal (Present marriage license and 12) Your Wedding. Since the Island is a very popular place for weddings, we need to schedule a date at least a year in advance to avoid being disappointed and then begin the preparation process 8 months in advance. Please contact the Parish Office 508-693-0342.


Sunday, April 28, 2024 Fifth Sunday of Easter

Gospel: (John 15:1-8)

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you. Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither; people will gather them and throw them into a fire and they will be burned. If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Reflection

This week, Jesus calls himself the vine and refers to his disciples as the branches. In this image, it is difficult to tell where the vine ends and branches begin. The life of the vine flows directly into the branches. This is the relationship Jesus desires to have with us. He invites us to remain in him. When we are rooted in Jesus, our lives bear the fruits of faithfulness and love. Love is more than a feeling. Love is an action, and our love for Jesus shows in how well we love our neighbor. How does your relationship with Jesus help you to live a life of love in action?

Consider stopping by with your family to spend some time with our Eucharistic Lord. Door code is available by calling the office 508-693-0342. Started on the Feast of Corpus Christi weekend, June 18/19, 2022 and has followed monthly with our First Friday through First Saturday Masses both held at 8:00 am, St. Augustine's Church.

Eucharistic Adoration is adoring or honoring the Eucharistic Presence of Christ. In a deeper sense, it involves "the contemplation of the Mystery of Christ truly present before us." During Eucharistic Adoration, we "watch and wait," we remain "silent" in His Presence and open ourselves to His Graces which flow from the Eucharist. By worshiping the Eucharistic Jesus, we become what God wants us to be! Like a magnet, the Lord draws us to Himself and gently transforms us. In its fullest essence, Eucharistic Adoration is "God and man reaching out for each other at the same time!" Immersing oneself in silent Eucharistic Adoration is the secret to knowing the Lord.

Jesus waits for us in this Sacrament of Love. "I am the Bread of Life which came down from heaven." (John 6:41) The Eucharist is: Jesus truly present – Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity!

If you are interested and have already completed a CORI Form and the Safe Environment Online Training for Lay Volunteers, all you need to do is contact the office so that we can fill out a Petition form that will go to the Office of the Bishop. If you have not completed the CORI and Online Training, you will need to see Sue Pagliccia about getting that done first. Once completed, you can than fill out a Petition form with our office. The commissioning of Eucharistic Ministers is good for three years at which time a Petition for Renewal will need to be done. Once forms have been approved by the Office of the Bishop, Fr. Paul will install all present and new ministers on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, June 1-2, 2024.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Religious Formation for children ages 3-12 The True Vine: The Source of Our Lives and Fruitfulness

How wonderful this weekend our eleven First Reconciliation and First Communion students are on retreat beginning with the 9:00 am Mass *AND* along with their families will witness the celebration the Sacrament of Confirmation for our seven high school students. Such an abundance of grace in one Mass! Today's Gospel reading of the Parable of the True Vine is the new way these younger students have come to know Jesus over the last few months of their sacramental preparation. It expands on last week's Gospel of the Good Shepherd who loves them and cares for them, who protects them and guides them, who calls them by name and they in turn follow the One who knows them. We had much more to learn in our covenant relationship with Jesus who now prepares us for fruitfulness—our work with God in building the kingdom.



The True Vine, Basilica of St. Clement, Rome

The image of a vine or vineyard has been a frequent metaphor for God's people used by the prophets, both positively (Is. 27:2-6; Ez. 19:10-11; Hos. 10:1) and negatively (Is. 5:1-7; Jer. 2:21; Ez. 19:12-14). Some scholars trace the metaphor of the vine as the theme of the relationship between the Father and the Son such that it makes sense for Jesus to identify Himself as the true vine. Today's Gospel stresses the necessity of abiding in Jesus, and contrasts the results of remaining and not remaining with God. Jesus' I AM statement, "I am the true vine ..." points to what He does by His saving revelation: Jesus provides us with the unique source of life and fruitfulness. God the Father is introduced as the vine grower who cares for the well-being and fruitfulness of the vine. See how the Father loves!

The disciples to whom Jesus speaks are told they were made clean (pruned) and are to be fruitful branches because they have heard and accepted the word of Jesus. Yet, this life-giving bond cannot be taken for granted. This life of union is begun but not perfected (think of Judas' betrayal and Peter's denial). Jesus makes clear each must remain; each must live in unity with Christ because no branch can ever bear fruit if is separated from the vine. Fruitfulness is not a matter of enjoying oneness with the Master, it consists of *doing something*. And this something has already been summarized in the command to love, which Jesus taught would be the mark of His disciples, after washing their feet before the Last Supper. The mission Jesus shared with His disciples is to give glory to the Father. These words are for us too.

In meditating on this Scripture with the children we try to emphasize this desired union. Not only for them to want it, but their parents too. Yet they hear what happens when one doesn't remain. A disciple who doesn't abide in Jesus is cast out, withered, lifeless in fact ... gathered and burned; it is the only possible end for dead wood. You can almost hear that inaudible gasp! Not one of them wants to be cut off from God's life and love—they know it is a choice, their choice. The students want God to love them, to prune them, to fill them with the Holy Spirit who is the Divine Sap that flows from the Father through the Son to them. They want to be where Jesus comes to be with them, and remains with them—the sacraments of the Church, especially Holy Communion. They desire to love in their actions and their words, with Jesus' help, as He tells them (maxims) and shows them (miracles). These children need our help too. They need this community to model and live this unity to the fullest. Keep praying for them and their families. And celebrate with us as God loves them in their first experience of the Sacrament of Penance today, and then the Holy Eucharist next weekend!

Congratulations to our Confirmation students: Sophia Alves, Victoria Dias, Melissa Louback, Humberto McGroarty Sampaio, Charlotte Sebastian, Ashley Silva and Kayllison Vial. We pray for these young people, His servants, whom the gift of the Holy Spirit has confirmed: that, planted in faith and grounded in love, they may bear witness to Christ the Lord by their way of life.
